(Special to the Guardian) CHICAGO, Nov. 1.—Mayor William Hale Thompson today was fighting a battle more important to him than any he had faced in his spectacular political career. Peritonitis a dread aftermath of appendicitis operations possible symptoms of which were reported in his case, was the Mayor's foe, but whether he would win or lose could not be told until some time tomorrow afternoon, physicians said. Courage—That all important ally in fighting disease—however, was with the Mayor and this with his favorable reaction from the shock of his operation at 2 p. m. yesterday, gave friends hope that the ultimate outcome would be victory. His wife and the few friends permitted in his room at the Passavant Hospital following the operation were met with smiles, and were comforted by the calm determination with which he was fighting for recovery.
