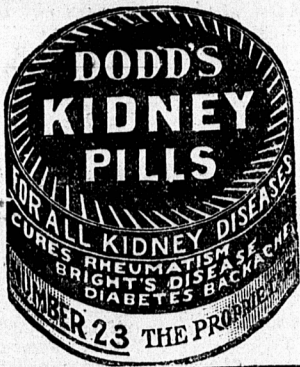

London, May 24—Commenting on New Zealand's concurrence in the desire of the Admiralty to employ the new battle cruiser presented by the Dominion to the Imperial Navy, in home waters, the Sydney Telegraph says that in view of Winston Churchill's doctrine of the withdrawal of the semblance of New Zealand's local naval force seems to leave the Australian Commonwealth in the position of guardian of Australian waters with their separate units—Commonwealth, Dominion and adjacent islands. It adds: "The responsibility is a large one, even in its purely Australian aspect, but its ready acceptance, is beyond doubt—whatever may be thought of the policy adopted. Our national duty is now to make the best of it and that best may be a good thing for the Empire."

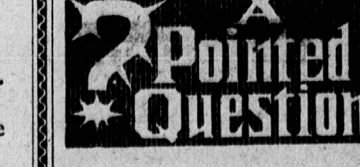
