THE WORK OF THE Y. M. C. A.

One of the great problems of our modern society is what is to be done with the hundreds of thousands of young men who flock into all our large centres of population. Today the large cities are growing more rapidly on an average than ever before. Some twenty-five years ago only a small percentage of our people lived in the cities. To-day it is estimated that in the United States thirty three per cent of the entire population live in the towns and cities of the land. The great cities of the old world are still growing while our western towns are building up rapidly. It is a fact that it is not always the best class of citizens that pour into our cities but generally we find that quite a number of them are men and boys of shady doings and questionable records.

But not only do this class of persons, gravitate to the centers, but also a great number of young men from the farming districts are attracted by the crowds and the opportunities for employment. Men from every land, representing every race, color, and creed are there. This cosmopolitan character of the inhabitants of our towns and cities make any form of organized moral and religious work difficult. The necessity for some definite effort for this great changing class would be readily apparent.

Vice and crime rage rampant wherever, large numbers of men are found together. In the face of these facts the question is asked how are those men and especially the young men to be reached with elevating and religious influences.

The question has found its answer more satisfactorily to-day, we think, in the organization known as the Young Men's Christian Association, than in any other movement. This organization aims to do work for young men by young men. As most of our readers are aware its object is to develop a symmetrical Christian manhood. It aims to develop the physical, intellectual and spiritual. It is interdenominational in character and performs a work that must always be auxiliary to the Christian Church.

At present many of the citizens of Charlottetown are anxious that our Association should be placed on a more satisfactory basis. The need for such a work among the young men of our city is apparent to all. The difficulty seems to be in the securing of a secretary qualified by training and experience to undertake the

College Y. M. C. A. Organized at P. of W. College.

Yesterday morning, all the students of P. W. C. who were interested had an opportunity of hearing an address by Mr. George Irving, on the College Y. M. C. A. Dr. Anderson presided and assured the students that if they decided to organize that he would do everything he could to help the work along.

Mr. Irving briefly explained the purposes of the organization, after which an opportunity was given for an expression of opinion regarding the proposed organization. On motion it was decided to form a Y. M. C. A. at once with the following officers:—

These officers constitute the Executive Committee.

At 7 o'clock in the evening a good number met in Dr. Anderson's class room where Mr. Irving gave an address, taking as his subject part of 45 verse of 1st chap. of John's gospel. "Thou art Simon son of Jonah shalt be called rock. He spoke of the

reputation that Simon had earned for changeableness and untrustworthiness. But Christ knew the desire for a change of life and offered to give him a rock like nature. But notwithstanding this promise Peter afterwards denied his Lord with curses. Was his nature never changed? Yes, as evidenced by Peter's address to the murderer of Jesus as told in the 4th chap. of acts. What is the secret? Peter was full of Holy Ghost.

Professing Christians were advised to claim this rock-like nature. The great importance of having a rock-like foundation was impressed upon all students. At the close of the address several students spoke showing their sympathy with the movement.

The Health Commandments.

The following ten rules are being quoted by English medical journals:

1. Don't leave your rooms in the morning with an empty stomach.
2. Never expose yourself to cold air immediately after you have partaken of a warm liquid, any kind.
3. Don't leave your obode in cold weather without warm wraps around your shoulders and breast.
4. Begin respiration in the cold by breathing through the nose. This will give the air a chance to get warm before reaching the lungs.
5. Never place your back near a heated oven or against a wall, warm or cold.
6. Don't stand before an open window in a railway carriage, nor take a drive in open carriage, after violent physical exercise.
7. Don't remain motionless in a cold room, and do not stand in an open space, on ice or snow.
8. Talk only when you must, for the old phrase, "Speech is silver, silence is gold," holds good even in hygiene.
9. Don't put off your regular bath. When the skin is not kept fresh and soft the cold draws the pores together and you are rendered susceptible.
10. Don't retire with cold or wet feet. Nothing prevents sleep with so much certainty as the neglect of your pedal extremities.

DYING IN PRISON.

Strong Effort Made to Secure James Baxter's Release.

MONTREAL, Sept. 5.—A strong effort is being made to secure the release of James Baxter, who was some months ago sent to the St. Vincent de Paul penitentiary, having been found guilty on a charge of defrauding the Ville Marie Bank. Leading physicians have made a report that Baxter cannot live much longer in or out of prison. Baxter is confined in the hospital, and is being kept alive by the injection of serum. He is so weak and emaciated that he cannot talk, and simply lies quietly awaiting the end. The day that Baxter was placed under arrest he is said to have weighed 193 pounds, and today he weighs only 119, a loss of 74 pounds. With the reports of the physicians, and a petition signed by a large number of men including members of Parliament of both sides of politics, Mrs. Baxter left this morning to make the effort to save her husband from dying in prison.
