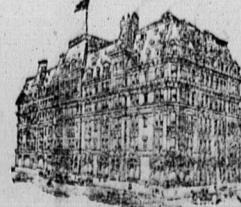

CARE OF THE NAILS.

Sharp instruments of any kind must not be used on the finger nails.

It is a mistake to say they can be cleaned only by a pointed steel.

A bit of wood will answer the same purpose, and that without harm to the skin.

One end should be slightly sharpened, though not pointed.

When the nails are stained beneath the surface the merest thread of a sorbent cotton should be wrapped over the thin end of the stick, which is then wet, and rubbed across a piece of moist soap.

If the cotton is then worked to and fro under the nail, that also being wet, the stain will rapidly disappear. Should it be an obstinate discoloration a drop of peroxide may be necessary to apply at the same time.

When old skin is removed from the surface at the base of the nails they must be soaked for at least ten minutes to soften the particles adhering.

This is highly important and to omit it is to break the nail enamel. It does not grow over, but remains a dull, bony appearing spot until it is high enough to fly from the top.

Cutting the nails is always a mistake, for it invariably causes the nail to thicken.

The ideal condition for beauty is thinness and transparency. In polishing, powdered pumice should not be used oftener than once a week and only once every two weeks if the nails are in good condition.

The friction rubs down surface roughness, but at the same time it slightly thins the enamel.

A little will do no harm, but continued applications will work havoc.

CRUELTY REBUKED.

A civil engineer tells this story. He was overseeing a gang of men, who, with mule teams, were hauling loads of earth when a friend came up by his side, watching the operation. The friend was a professional ventriloquist, which fact was unknown to the men. Presently a mule driven by a large fiery-tempered man, balked and the driver began to belabor the animal with his whip. Every now and then the mule would turn its head and look at the man in that reproachful way which mules have, but it would not move an inch.

"Just watch this man," ventured the ventriloquist to his friend. At that moment the driver lost all patience and gave the animal a kick in the ribs. The mule turned its head and opened its mouth, and apparently from its lips came in angry tones: "Don't do that again!"

The whip dropped from the man's hand. For a moment he stared at the mule, and then, without uttering a word, turned and ran away as fast as his legs could carry him.

SIR WILFRID LAURIER GOES TO TORONTO.

OTTAWA, Nov. 10—Sir Wilfrid and Lady Laurier, accompanied by Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, left tonight for Toronto.

Mayor Armstrong, of Edmonton, is here at the head of a deputation to urge the government to remove the penitentiary to the outskirts of the city. They claim that as at present the situation, almost in the centre of the town, is an impediment to the extension of local improvements.

At the conclusion of today's cabinet council, the prime minister formally announced the appointment of Hugh Kelly, of Toronto, to the high court bench, in succession to the late Judge MacMahon.

PRESTON RESIGNS.

LONDON, Nov. 10—The Canadian Associated Press learns that W. T. Preston has sent to Ottawa his resignation of Trade Commissioner in Holland. Mr. Preston is returning to Canada and possibly will later accept a position in New York offered by a prominent Berlin firm.

G. T. P. CHEATED OF \$10,000.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 10—It became known yesterday that between September 15 and 17 last a gang of forgers defrauded the Canadian Pacific Railway Company out of \$10,000 by cashing worthless pay checks. Hotel men were the principal victims. The railway company's pay checks are colored differently each month and the fraud was detected by the banks when the September checks were presented on the same colored paper as on the previous month. The gang is reported to have made another haul farther West where the pay day is five days later.

ACCEPT AWARD.

OTTAWA, Nov. 10—The Labor Department today received word from the Grand Trunk Pacific employees accepting the award of the Board appointed by the Department to settle the wages' dispute between the men and the company. The Board granted an increase, but the Grand Trunk Pacific Co. refuses to accept the award on the ground that they are now paying a high rate of wages, and that they have established similar shop rules to those approved in the East.

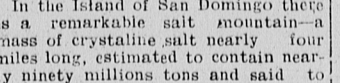

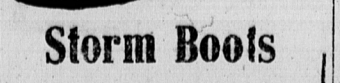
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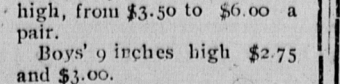
