TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION.

One of the most interesting of the annual gatherings that take place in this city is that of the Provincial Teachers' Association. The large attendance of teachers from all parts of the Island, with the visitors from abroad, all interested in the great work of teaching, indicate that the present meeting will be quite as engaging and important as that of any previous year.

The resolve adopted at a previous annual meeting looking to the direct representation of the Association in the Board of Education is, we think, a good one and ought to be conceded by the government. It would be of advantage to those who have to shape the policy of the country in educational matters to be thus brought into more direct contact with those engaged in teaching work.

Perhaps no other body of workers in the great task of human enlightenment and betterment more largely moulds and influences the rising generation than the teachers in the common schools of the country. Upon them very largely depends not only what shall be the educational status of the people when our boys and girls have grown to be men and women, but also what their thoughts, aims, aspirations and usefulness will be.

The city railway station and headquarters of the railway system of the Island was badly located in the first place, too far from the centre of business in the city, and on low and unhealthy ground. The want of proper drainage has aggravated the evil and now fever has broken out as a natural consequence of the mistake.

The British Columbia government is said to have determined to "ride for a fall" and will select the speaker when the house meets from their own ranks, and then, if defeated, will ask for a dissolution. They thus invite an appeal to the people and are confident of being sustained.

EDITORIAL NOTES.

We have seen as yet no accurate estimate of the total vote cast respectively for and against prohibition. In all not more than about 300,000 votes seem to have been polled in the proportion of about 162,000 in favor and 138,000 against.

There are about 100,000 Indians in Canada and about five times that number in the United States. Our Canadian Indians cost the country something less than a million dollars yearly, while the cost to the Republic on Indian account is over thirteen millions a year.

The recent massacre in Armenia grows out of the former persecutions by a natural process. A large number of the persecuted Christians had fled across the boundary into Russian territory for protection, leaving their homes and possessions behind them.

Not much seems to have been gained in time by the establishing of a dead letter branch in Halifax to relieve the necessity of sending to the dead letter office in Ottawa. This is how it works. On September 28th a letter from this office, directed to a subscriber in Malpeque, P. E. I., was inadvertently dropped into the Charlottetown office without a stamp on it.

A Mammoth Monument.

CLEVELAND, O., Oct. 2.—The tallest and heaviest monolith ever quarried in the United States will mark the family tomb of John D. Rockefeller in Lake View cemetery. The monument will be such as plain, but it will attract attention from its mammoth size. It will be erected in November by Joseph Corabelli, who has been awarded the contract.

The cost of the monument is stupendous, and the cost of preparing for its erection will run into the thousands of dollars.

The monument will be sixty-five feet high from the base to the top. It will be six feet square at the base. It will be erected on the same ridge as the Garfield Memorial and will be the centre of a circle of vaults which contain, or which will contain, the bodies of the Rockefeller family members.

The base will be ten feet high; the single stone that surmounts it fifty-five feet high. It has been dressed at the quarry at Barre, Vt., and it is the largest stone that can be shipped by rail without straining bridges and demolishing rail-roads.

Special cars of extraordinary strength have been constructed at the oil magnate's order to convey this monster stone to Cleveland, and the bridge over which these cars will pass will be thoroughly inspected just before the cars cross them. The stone will arrive in Cleveland about Oct. 15.

On the second base the word "Rockefeller" will appear in raised letters. In awarding the contract, Mr. Rockefeller said: "I do not want the monument to attract much attention."

A significant fact in connection with the letting of the contract for the monument is that recently John D. Rockefeller three times tried to move his permanent home from Tarrytown, N. Y., to Cleveland. The building of the monument is taken here as an indication that he has decided to make the change.
