Mrs. Charles A. Beer, was among the popular hostesses inviting friends for a five table bridge on Wednesday afternoon.

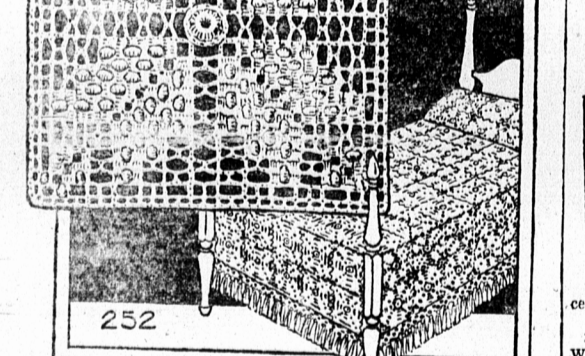

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BOOKS, ART, MUSIC

"Farewell Romance" by Gilbert Frankau is a long novel of modern London, including in its background such events as the Jubilee and the death of King George V.

Some recent choices of distinguished English books by eminent Canadian critics include "The Life of George Moore" by Joseph Hone "Autobiography of G. K. Chesterton," "Swinnerton: An autobiography," "A. E. Housman" by A. F. S. Gow, "The Hundred Years" by Philip Guedalla, "More Poems" by A. E. Housman, "In the Step of St. Paul" by H. V. Morton, "Laughing Gas" by P. G. Wodehouse.

For the past few months in London an exhibition of British Inn signs has been held. These tavern signs have been gathered from all over the United Kingdom and the collection is large and varied.

Some of the signs were of historical significance, some were entirely humorous, and they were frequently painted or carved by artists of ability because inn-keepers were among the best-paying of the patrons.

An account of this interesting exhibition says: "Tavern signs go back to an era when many people could not read. Hence their lettering was added by images of animals, birds and various inanimate objects. The oldest sign exhibited in the British Museum bears a white swan and, although on it rests the marks of five centuries, it carries the message that the first hominid who put it above a door was an adherent of the royal Plantagenets, in whose coat of arms that bird appears."

In the current exhibition at London there is a sign attributed to Hogarth and bearing the legend, "The Man Loaded With Mischief." It represents a forlorn individual carrying on his shoulders a woman, a monkey and a magpie. The lady has in her right hand a bottle of gin. Probably this sign was once on a temperance house.

Other signs at this unique exhibition bear such names and facsimiles as "The Spotted Cow," "The Mytton and Mermaid," "The Cricketers' Hale," "The Coked Hat," "Chequers," "Traveller's Joy" (a mug of ale and some cheese etc.) "Five Bells," "The Boar's Head," "The New Wellington," and many others.

Vaughn Williams, famous English composer, has a new work ready for production. It is a musical-drama "Riders to the Sea," a musical setting of J. M. Synge's play.

The London Daily Telegraph writes of it: "The composer uses a small orchestra to accompany a vocal line that scrupulously represents the tone of expressive speech. In performance Synge's text, while given the heightened beauty of music, should be as clear as in the spoken play."

The new British Music Drama Opera Company has just finished a successful season at Covent Garden in London. The producer of the Company is Vladimir Rosing, and the conductor and artistic director Albert Coates whose new opera "Pickwick" was produced for the first time.

A report from London says: "Pickwick" proved a success for the producer, the stage director and the singers. It was interpreted by a cast which included some of the best artists we have; it established a record by beginning punctually, and created further records for rapid changes of scene and short intervals. As for the opera, it was enjoyed, as it was bound to be, given the solid hold Pickwick has in our affections—no more. He is like the true lover of Dickens—he is Mr. Coates has tried to collect as many incidents as could possibly be brought within the ambit of a single evening's entertainment. It seems rather curious that a man of Mr. Coates' experience of the theatre did not realize the weakness of a story thus told in fragments. Of course to omit anything in the case of Pickwick must be a cause for regret.

"The music which accompanies the action, has the merit of being invariably apt and to the point. Slightly seasoned with sentiment when the situation allows it, it follows each incident fittingly and without labour. Apart from this it has no outstanding quality. THE COOK'S CORNER

TEA BISCUITS. One cup pastry flour, 2 teaspoons baking-powder, 1-4 teaspoon salt 1 or 2 level teaspoons shortening (half butter, half lard), 1-3 cup sweet milk. All measurements are level.

Method: Mix flour, salt and baking-powder by sifting together, cut in shortening with a knife, mix milk in with knife, too. Turn out in floured board, roll 3-4 of an inch thick. Cut with medium-sized cutter and bake in hot oven about 15 minutes, 400 degrees.
