## THE COLLIER STORSTAD IS UNDER ARREST

to send out every boat he had, in spite of the desperate condition of his own ship.

The owners of the Storstad ask of the public that, in all fairness to both vessels and their commanders, judgment as to where the blame for this terrible disaster should rest, be suspended until an impartial tribunal has heard the evidence of both sides.

The seizure of the Storstad was at the instance of the C. P. R. Company, whose claim against the owners of the collier, the Maritime Steamship Company of Norway, is for two million dollars loss. There may be a further claim by the C. P. R. for loss of cargo. The owners of the Storstad will, it is understood, put up bonds tomorrow, so that the vessel may be released. No inconvenience will be caused by the arrest, as in the meantime the Storstad will be unloading her cargo and reloading.

MONTREAL, May 30.—Has the curse of Dr. D. Crippen at last worked its evil upon Captain Kendall?

That is the question many people who were intimately acquainted with the Crippen case of four years ago will ask themselves.

It was in those very waters, of that forbidding headland in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, where the Empress of Ireland, went down that Captain Kendall handed the wretched doctor, till then unaware that his disguise had been penetrated, over to the tender mercies of Scotland Yard Inspector Dew and the officers of the police force of the province of Quebec.

"You will suffer for this treachery," the enraged Crippen, fixing his bulging eyes upon the trim young captain, is reported to have threatened when he was searched, but no one paid any special attention to the words.

Today they loom up large and lurid, pregnant with malevolent prophecy.

It was in those waters four years ago, where Captain Kendall came to fame and laid the foundation for future advancement and it was within only a few miles from the spot where Crippen met with the greatest disaster that can well befall the master of a ship.

There are just two months difference in the season. Crippen was captured at the end of July, but the weather in the Gulf must have been identical.

On the night previous to the capture, while the army of reporters and artists from all over the world were anxiously waiting the S. S. Montrose's arrival and the whole world, but Dr. Crippen himself knew that his identity had been discovered, the ghastly piercing wail of the gigantic foghorn at Father Point, which is expelled with sufficient force to blow away a grown up man or two of them, should they rashly venture close in front of it and makes sufficient noise as it leaves the mouth piece to break the ear drums, kept sending out its warning at minute intervals.

So it must have done last night assuring the twelve hundred people on board the doomed Empress that every thing was being done to prevent possible collision.

In that the two nights were similar but what a different picture the next morning.

When the fog lifted on the Sunday forenoon that, Crippen was arrested, the telegraphic arteries emanating from the signal station at Father Point, from which so many tales of disaster, of smuggling feuds, and of joyful receptions of viceroys have been sent broadcast have told the civilized world that a dangerous malefactor had been captured; when the fog lifted this morning they were carrying a tale of horror sufficiently awful to paralyze a nation.

HENLEY, Eng., June 1.—The suffragettes arson squad today destroyed the historic parish church of St. Mary's, Wargrave. It was built in 1538. They also burned a mansion near Windsor, formerly the residence of the Duchess of Sutherland.
