WOODSTOCK, N. B., Feb. 14.—Mrs. A. Dunstan, 1st Field Company Engineers, who was drowned at Petawawa last summer has been granted a pension of \$338 per year by the Dominion Government. The pension is divided as follows. The widow gets \$191.62, and each daughter \$73 until they are 18 years of age. Sergeant Major Dunstan came to this town to live after the South African War, where he served with the British Army.

JAPANESE EXPLORERS MAY HAVE PERISHED.

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, Feb. 15.—The arrival at Christchurch of Scott's ship, the Terra Nova, has given rise to considerable uneasiness concerning the fate of the Japanese South Polar expedition under Lieut N. Shiraso, which has not been heard from.

H. G. Ponting, a photographer, who accompanied Captain Scott's expedition, was aboard the Terra Nova. He was quoted as saying that the Scott explorers had found traces of the Japs, and that the indications were that the Shiraso party might have been overwhelmed by the same Antarctic blizzard that killed Scott and his men.

The Japanese Antarctic expedition set out from Yokohama in 1910 in a 150-ton schooner.

REFORM OF WALL STREET METHODS PROPOSED.

ALBANY, N. Y., Feb. 14.—The compulsory incorporation of the New York Stock Exchange is proposed in a bill drafted by Governor Sulzer for introduction in the Legislature today. The measure also would bring all stock exchanges under the supervision and regulation of the State authorities.

The Governor said that the introduction of the bill does not commit him to it. He believes the advisability of enacting such a law or leaving the Exchange as a voluntary association is a matter that should be very carefully considered by the Legislature.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Feb. 14.—

Arthur Gibson, of Chester County, who was serving an eight year sentence for highway robbery, was found dead in his cell in the Eastern Penitentiary. He had been murdered by his cellmate, Joseph Bray of Chester, Pa., who was found bleeding to death beside him. The throats of both were cut.

Bray in a moment of consciousness admitted he had killed Gibson and slashed his own throat with a razor.

Bray was serving a twenty year term for murder. The officials believe he became enraged when Gibson taunted his cellmate with the fact he would have to spend another holiday season in prison.

Gibson would have been released December 5 of this year.

There is an investigation to learn how Bray obtained the razor, which is not the kind used in the prison.

This morning. A witness refused to answer question, and it was decided to report him to the House.

R. C. Miller, of Montreal, head of the Diamond Light and Heating Company of that city, swore a couple of years ago in a court proceeding that he had secured business from the Liberal government to the extent of \$117,000 and had to pay \$11,000 to get it.

The other members of his company sued him to recover the amount and the public accounts committee of that session got after the information and subpoenaed Mr. Miller to appear before it.


He did not obey the summons then, but did so this morning. When asked to whom he had paid the \$11,000 he declined to state, giving his reason for refusing that an answer would prejudice pending litigation. Mr. Meighen demanded that the witness be reported. After some discussion the witness was allowed to make the following statement: "In addition to the fact that my answer would prejudice the case now in the courts, my refusal is due to the fact that I never paid a dollar to any Senator or member of parliament or official of the government. I think it is not quite clear what parliament can do to a witness who declines."
