HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

To test tea, burn a small quantity on a metal plate. With good tea the amount of ashes remaining is small, increasing in quantity as the quality of the sample tested deteriorates.

Even when there is cream in the coffee, stains can be removed from the most delicate silk or woolen fabric by brushing the spot with pure glycerine and rinsing in lukewarm water.

If you have not access to a hot-water bag when it is needed, a good substitute is a flannel bag filled with hot sand or salt. A good deal is to keep half a dozen little ones filled and ready.

In pressing any clothes or goods where it is customary to place a cloth over them when ironing, use a newspaper instead. It gives a gloss to ribbon or silk, leaves no lint and stiffens cambric.

Boke a small portion of beans in a little earthen jar the size of a teacup and put it in the children's lunch box. Such a cup is good used for custards, scalloped potatoes or a favorite pudding.

To soften brushes that have become hard, soak twenty-four hours in raw linseed oil and rinse in hot turpentine. Or they may be washed in hot soda and water with soft soap.
