Girls Contribute Mobile Canteen To Children's Fund

TORONTO, April 20.—The girls of Havergal College, Toronto, have just received a message from Lord Worley Regional Administrator, Women's Voluntary Services for Civil Defence, Kent, England, thanking them for their gift of a mobile canteen to the Save The Children Fund. She writes: "The canteen will be used immediately for feeding school children in the rural area in Kent. The W. V. S. staff working on the canteen will enormously appreciate the lovely vehicle and take great pride in it."

This canteen is the third vehicle sent to Britain through the efforts of students of Havergal College under the principalship of Miss G. E. Millard. In 1941 the girls ran a money to buy a station wagon and in 1942 an ambulance was supplied to the Red Cross Society.

The presentation of the Havergal College canteen was made by Viscount Samuel on behalf of the Save the Children Fund. Mrs. Maurice Bridgeman, of the W. V. S. accepted it.

"After the war the canteen will be used by the Save the Children Fund for relief work in Europe," Lord Samuel said.

MISS ELIZABETH B. CAHILL

The deep sympathy of the people of Alberton, Kildare and vicinity will go out to the family of Elizabeth B. Cahill, whose death took place at the Charlottetown Hospital on April 6th, after a brief illness and operation, at the age of 73 years. Miss Cahill was born at Kildare but was living at Alberton with her sister at the time of her death. She was educated in the district school and at English Convent. She spent the greater part of her life in the U. S. A. where she earned her living by nursing. She was of a quiet unassuming disposition. At heart, deeply religious, her piety found outward expression in the many beautiful poems from her pen, published at different times in American and Canadian magazines.

She was also a raconteuse of no mean ability and the snatches of humour which interspersed her stories were the delight of her hearers. Among the many of her writings to be published was "The Story of Cahill-Croft", which appeared in the "Maple Leaf Magazine" of Oakland, California, in 1932.

She leaves to mourn their loss, two sisters (Margaret) Mrs. James Whalen, of Alberton; Sister Anastasia of the Order of St. Joseph, Boston, and one brother, Walter, in Edmonton.

Elizabeth Cahill was buried in Alberton in the R. C. Cemetery of Sacred Heart Church.
