

FUNERAL TO-DAY.—The funeral of the late Mr. George R. Garrett will take place this morning, on the arrival of the Murray Harbor train, at 10.15, to the People's cemetery.

AINSLIE LEAVING LAHAVE.—Sails will be hoisted soon on the tern schooner Ainslie, as she is overdue to leave LaHave for Souris, P. E. I., with molasses brought up from Barbados, says a Halifax exchange. She goes from the Island port to Gaspe to load shingles for a West Indian Island.

THE BAIT SUPPLY.—Queensport, says a Halifax exchange, reports herring very scarce in nets Wednesday. Murray Harbor reports about sixty barrels taken in traps at Souris. Plenty of herring at Amherst and at Etang du Nord in trap and seine. One trap full at Grindstone at House Harbor, signs of herring in traps but still scarce.

TO MEET IN JUNE.—The annual branch meeting of the Women's Missionary Society of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island will be held in Sackville on June 4-6.
