SUMMERSIDE TORMENTINE.

The Natural Route to the Island is the Opinion of the Sackville Post.

The Prince Edward Island gentlemen who visited Sackville Tuesday evening seemed thoroughly convinced of the practicability of the Summerside-Cape Tormentine route. Whatever ideas they previously entertained with regard to the terminal facilities at the Cape, and the condition of the N. B. & P. E. I. railway, they certainly returned to their homes satisfied that neither the railway nor the wharf stand in the way of making a successful test of this route. They made the journey from the Cape to Sackville, some 37 miles in an hour and twenty minutes, and we are very much in doubt if equally good time could be made on any other branch line in this province.

So far as we can see there is no difficulty now in the way of making a successful test of this route, and in fact continuing it summer and winter, for a

glance at the situation must convince even the most skeptical, that this is the natural route to the Island. The matter of through rates over the N. B. & P. E. I. road remains to be adjusted, but if the minister of railways is anxious to accede to the request of a large number of Island people, there should not be the slightest trouble in adjusting the rates. The directors of the N. B. & P. E. I. railway feel disposed to go even more than half way in order to give this route a trial. President Wood stated at the Brunswick Home dinner Tuesday evening that they would do everything in their power, in reason, to further this scheme. Of course this road cannot be expected to work for nothing any more than other railways, but if Hon. Mr. Blair is disposed to go half way in this matter, he will certainly find the directors of the local road willing and anxious to meet him.

MADAM AFTER THIS.

OTTAWA, November 24.—During the year ending September 30th the prerogative of mercy was exercised in 329 criminal cases. Of these 167 were granted tickets of leave. One convict actually refused a ticket of leave, preferring the good grub and warmth of Kingston penitentiary to the cold weather outside. One ticket of leave was forfeited, one cancelled, and one granted for the purpose of enabling a convict to see his dying mother. 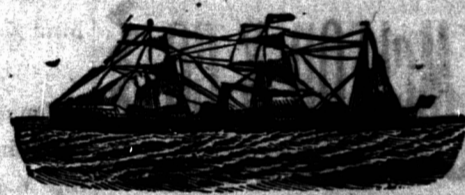
