ALL THE ABOVE ANNUALS 15c PER DOZ. Seeding Pansies, Salvia, (Deep Scarlet) very fine. Seeding Dahlias and Seeding Carnations 20c per doz. Double dandelias, 8c each. Perennials Wintered Over, (Large Clump plants) Pansy, Daisy, Carnations, Dianthus, Sweet William, Forgetmenot and Hollyhocks 5c each, 50c per doz. Vegetable Plants.—Extra early transplanted cabbage plants 50c per hundred. Late cabbage plants 12c per hundred. (Ready about 15th June. Cauliflower and Celery 75c per hundred. Late tomato plants 2c per doz. Extra early tomato plants 40c per doz. Cucumber 15c per doz. Pumpkin and squash 2c per doz.

We mail annuals postage free, but perennials add 1c each extra. Late Cabbage plants 5c extra per hundred, transplanted early cabbage cauliflower and celery 10c must be added per hundred for postage. Late tomato plants 3c per doz. extra for postage, and very early tomato plants 6c per doz. must be added for postage. Large orders should go by express or freight.
