The five years' contract between the City and the Light and Power Company will not expire until some eighteen months hence, but in the meantime it is necessary that a new or renewed contract shall be made...

lighting in Charlottetown quite so cheaply as it is had in Toronto, Ottawa or Montreal where the current is produced by water power, instead of coal, and where a vast volume of electricity is utilized not only for lighting those cities, but for operating street cars and factories.

Under the existing five-year contract the city pays \$73 a year for each of the arc lamps and \$18 each for 40 incandescents, with \$20 each for 15 more. This is coupled with a stipulation that commercial lighting shall be supplied at a rate of 11 cents net per kilowatt.
