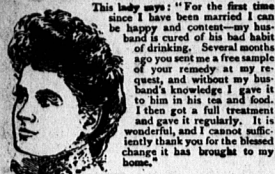

TODAY IN PRINCE COUNTY.

Let no man underrate the importance of the election in Prince County today. No sober, right-thinking citizen should neglect to cast his vote. That duty is important, first of all to his home and his family and equally so to the community in which he lives and to the Province at large.

For reasons known to themselves the liquor interests, the men engaged in the unlawful and destructive whiskey trade and their misguided supporters have arrayed themselves in opposition to the forward movement, and profess themselves the ardent supporters of the Scott Act. They want that Act continued, not that they may obey it, but that they may continue to violate it as they have hitherto done with impunity; not that sobriety, and order may be established and maintained but that rum-selling and drinking may enable them to make profit by the ruin of their fellows.

It is the temperance people, the friends of order and sobriety, the best citizenship of the country, the pastors of churches, the loving fathers and mothers who would save their children from the demoralizing influences of the liquor traffic, who will today vote against the Scott Act in order to bring in a better and more efficient law. No man will make a mistake if today he goes to the poll and votes with those who have just named. The man who votes with the rum-seller today lends the liquor traffic his moral support.

There can be no question as to which side the religious and moral forces, the forces of law and order are arrayed upon today. Equally there is no question upon which side the forces of evil, of unlawful gain, of social demoralisation will be found. Today each elector will be known by the company he keeps, by the cause with which he is associated. Let every elector do his duty today. That duty is plain, clear as the sun at noonday in a cloudless sky. It is to go forward, not backward. It is to take a great stride in advance by voting against an ineffective law, to bring in an effective one. We have every confidence that the electors of Prince will do this today.

The Summerside Journal, the western organ of the Conservative party, is doing that party serious harm by so far as is possible associating it with the discredited whiskey traffic. No party can afford such a degrading alliance. There are a host of temperance men in the Conservative party who we feel sure will resent the Journal's attitude.

The Journal in its zeal for free rum in Summerside, quotes copiously from the anti-prohibition sermon of Rev. James Simpson of this city. We deal with that discourse at the time of its deliverance. Suffice it to say that three out of four of the clergymen of Prince Edward Island would regard themselves as betraying the cause of truth and right were they to give utterance to the views which Mr. Simpson promulgated. It is a discourse much more quoted and appreciated in the dens of drunkenness and vice than in the Christian homes of the community.

I am led to admire it for its Christian ethics and moral utterances, fearless and outspoken, glad to learn that even in old rum-soaked Charlottetown there is one editor who is neither ashamed nor afraid to unfurl the banner of Prohibition of the accursed liquor traffic. That traffic has brought misery and want, penury and suffering untold to many of the homes of the Island generally which otherwise would have been homes of peace and prosperity.

But, thank God there is a brighter future for Prince Edward Island with the incoming of Prohibition and the righteous enforcement of law state and civic and the reclamation of the habitual drunkards, or their dying off one by one and thus making way for a more sober, intelligent and thrifty progeny. I have taken much pleasure in reading the Island reminiscences some of which I myself recollect very vividly. I was born in Cascumpee, P. E. Island in the year 1824. My father and mother came to that place in 1817 from London, England in company with a gentleman by the name of Hill then doing a mercantile business at the west end of the Island. His store was burnt down, having been robbed and the goods being carried away in a scow, or lighter, a pack of knives and forks having been left in the bottom of the scow leading to the arrest of the perpetrators of the burglary and arson. My parents and family removed to Charlottetown in 1825 where they spent the remainder of their days.
