Germans Admit Scope Of Military Action

Reveal Wartime Adventures of Queen Mary

NEW YORK, Sept. 30 (CP)—British and Canadian censorship today permitted disclosure that the great British liner, Queen Mary, pride of the north Atlantic in peacetime, carried tens of thousands of Canadian and American troops across the Atlantic in 1942. The vast troopship, London disclosed, visited all the seven seas in her wartime journeys, and twice eluded grave danger. The dispatch also disclosed that she had been a frequent visitor to New York.

Quebec City in Dispute Over Church

QUEBEC, Sept. 30 (CP)—Mr. Justice Pierre Encrepe ordered in superior court here that all proceedings in connection with an expropriation notice served upon the city of Quebec be deferred pending judgement on an injunction which has been taken by the congregation against the city. Mr. Justice Encrepe's ruling made retiring because of age.

War Situation Last Night

A triple crisis for Nazi invaders of Russia appears to be developing rapidly along the important Dnieper defence line, overshadowing in military significance the probable entry of Allied troops into historic Naples. In Italy the battle might well develop into a foot-pole, as Anglo-American forward patrols seek to keep contact with the retreating enemy all across the Italian boot north of the Naples-Foggia line.

BATHURST, N.B., Sept. 30 (CP)—Leonard Bertin, 19, was killed instantly today but his parents escaped in a car when a first section of the Canadian National Railway's eastbound Ocean Limited struck an automobile at Berth.

Attributes Loss Of Tugboat Erg To Negligence

OTTAWA, Sept. 30 (CP)—Sinking of the tugboat Erg in Halifax harbor last July 6 with loss of 19 lives was caused by "the commission of duty, negligence and want of care and caution and poor seamanship" on the part of those charged with the responsibility of the conduct of the Norwegian ship Norge, Transport Minister Michaud announced today.

N. B. Potato Crop Largest In Ten Years

FREDERICTON, Sept. 30 (CP)—With New Brunswick on the eve of harvesting its largest potato crop in ten years, potato marketing specialist G. C. Cunningham predicted today that the close of the season would find this province the only one able to meet and exceed the Dominion Government appeal last spring for increased potato production to the tune of 100,000,000 bushels.

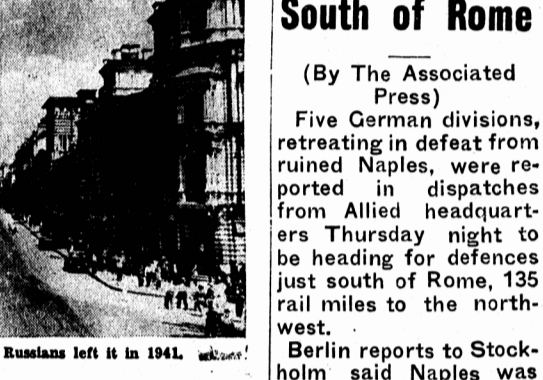
