AUSTRALIAN HORSE CHALLENGES WORLD

LONDON, Dec. 10.—(By The Canadian Press)—There is keen interest in English turf circles over the record of Phar Lap, the Australian three-year-old who has won the principal races in Australia this season. Phar Lap's owner, a man named Davis, has issued a challenge to the world—but he stipulates that any match that is arranged shall be on Phar Lap's own battle ground. And there is not much likelihood of English horse owners sending a challenger all the way to Australia. Similar ventures in the past have not turned out so well.

Phar Lap's owner suggests a race for "any distance, and any amount, which leads Sporting Life to remark: 'There is suggestion here that a second St. Simon has come forth, and on St. Simon the late "Matt" Dawson declared that he was as good at five miles as at five furlongs.'

In the possession of a horse of all-round ability such as this, any man is to be congratulated, no matter what part of the world he hails from, and it is particularly gratifying that the owner of Phar Lap is a son of the Empire.

But English owners of horses worthy to taking up such a challenge remember Papyrus, and the recent big-money inducements held out by American promoters for a world's championship test have so far tempted the former to send valuable properties across the seas. They consider that all the same can be won at home, and there is the prospect of the spoils of the race-track being materially added to in the shape of stud subscriptions.

"Good horses from distant parts of the world have always been welcome in this country," SPORTING LIFE says. A greater "sport" than Howard Bruce, of Baltimore, the owner of Billy Barton, who sent that horse twice across the Atlantic for the Grand National, and so near by won at the last time of asking,

one could not wish to know. Since then we have had John D. Hertz and Reigh Court, over from America, both helping to contribute a pleasing chapter in English turf history; and at the present time there is in this country Stephen II, belonging to an Australian enthusiast, Sol Green, who it is to be hoped, will see that horse to greater advantage when he returns next season."

Phar Lap is scheduled under "Class G," to which Brown Jack, Old Orkney, Sir Joshua, etc., belong and so if he did come to this country, he would not be qualified for the Ascot Cup. But he is a remarkably interesting individual, and those who have been regularly reading of his exploits will note with still more interest that he is essentially British-bred. His sire is Night Raid (Radium-Sensiment, by Spearmint), who was bought as a yearling by Douglas Peimann for \$800, and sold for less to go to Australia. There he changed hands twice, and, on breaking down, was sent to the stud in New Zealand. One of his first crops won the New Zealand Derby, and Phar Lap appeared the following year with the consequence that Night Raid, when last reported on, had a full list for two seasons at \$1,250.
