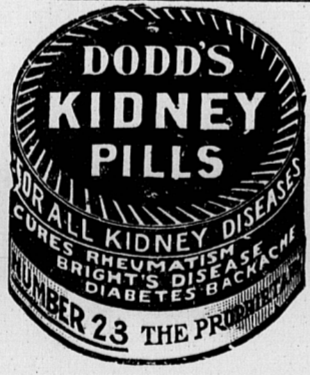
INDIAN SHOOTS OFFICER.

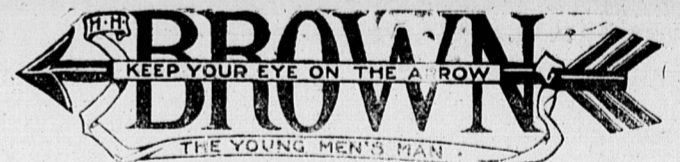
