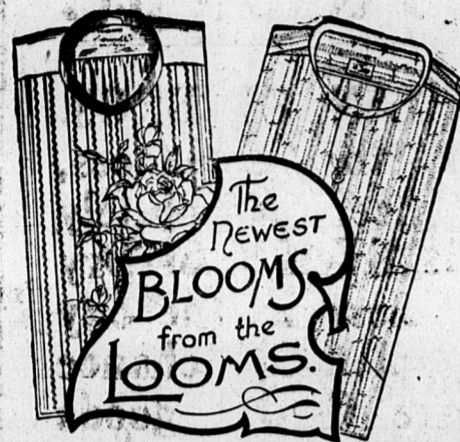

WARNS CANADIAN RAILWAYS TO LEAVE MAINE ALONE.

BOSTON, Mass., Feb. 20—The attitude of the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad with respect to possible action by the Massachusetts Legislature was candidly outlined by President Charles S. Mellen, of that railroad, in an address before the Boston Boot and Shoe Club tonight. "Clear away all the subtleties, all in touching on the public future relations of the New Haven, Boston & Maine and Canadian railroad, Mr. Mellen from the situation of the New Haven road in this commonwealth and there is little to have a controversy about," said Mr. Mellen. He continued: "If Massachusetts is content to execute her own laws within her own territory, she will have enough on her hands to occupy her time fully to the limit. And it is no part of the business of this commonwealth to seek to extend by agreement with the New Haven road, under threats of punishment, her jurisdiction over the action of a public service corporation in neighboring states that have never been declared incompetent. The Massachusetts Legislature's assertions, all the mis-statements of the Grand Trunk to secure a charter for a branch road in Rhode Island when he said that 'unprovoked attacks' by Canadian lines upon the business of New England railroads might change the friendly relations of both the New Haven and Boston & Maine, with their Canadian neighbors." Mr. Mellen regarded a through Boston-Buffalo line, advocated by Mayor Fitzgerald as feasible and thought a better one might be had through the use of existing lines than can be had through the construction of an additional one.

AN EASTERN S. S. MEETING.

ST JOHN, Feb. 21.—At a meeting of the stockholders of the Eastern Steamship Co. at the Lincoln National Bank, Bath, Tuesday, Frederick H. Low was elected clerk of the corporation and the following directors were re-elected: Calvin Austin, William T. Cobb, Eugene N. Foss, Josiah W. Hayden, William H. Hill, Charles F. Libby, Henry R. Mallory and Galen L. Stone. Those present were Calvin Austin of Boston, J. F. Liscomb of Portland, Assistant Treasurer R. A. Pepper, James Edward Drake of this city and F. S. Sherman of Rockland.

ALL VACANCIES FILLED.

LONDON, Feb. 21—Premier Asquith has filled vacancies in the Ministry, which is an indication that he expects the Government to pass safely through the crisis.

The new Ministers are: William Bann and Ernest Seares, Junior Lords of the Treasury; Edwin Montagu, Under Secretary for India; and Cecil Norton, Assistant Postmaster General.

Norton succeeds Sir Henry Norman, who failed of election. This completes the Ministry.

In the case of the Junior Lords, bye-elections will be necessary. But, as both had good majorities last month, there is little danger of their losing their seats.

RIOTS EVERYWHERE

IN PHILADELPHIA.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 21—Rioting in every section of the city followed the attempt of the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company to operate its lines.

Passengers and crews were driven from the cars by the infuriated mobs and, in a score of instances, the abandoned cars were burned or otherwise destroyed.

Stern measures were taken by the police to quell the disorder, and nearly five hundred persons were arrested, charged with theft.

Two women were hit by stray bullets, and many persons were removed to the hospitals.

Mayor Reubyn ordered Director Clay to swear in three thousand additional police and issued a proclamation enforcing the Riot Act.

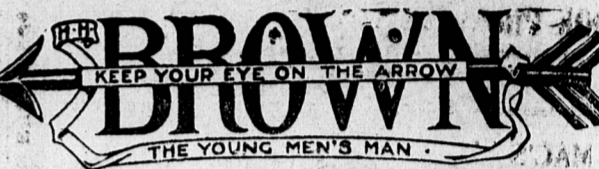
