EATING LESS MEAT.—Whether it is because of the increased cost of meat or because people's tastes have changed, the fact remains that the people of the United States are eating 8 per cent. less meat than they were 20 years ago. This is disclosed in a recent dietary survey made by the Department of Agriculture. In this survey 3,000 dietary records, each covering a period of seven days, were collected from 1,452 families and 575 individuals in forty-six states. Sixteen nationalities and many occupations and incomes were represented, as were also both urban and rural localities.
