1. That the sincere sympathy of the Synod be extended to Rev. Dr. Robert Johnson, Convener of the Board of Missions, who fell ill in Halifax on his way to the Synod, and that he be assured of the Synod's good wishes and its fervent prayers for his speedy recovery.

2. That tribute be paid to Dr. A. M. Gordon and to the Clerk of Synod for valuable home mission work done in the Province of New Brunswick.

3. That each Presbytery make a visitation to all aid-receiving congregations with a view to having them ready to supply the amount of grants required that such funds might be available for other extension work.

On motion of Mr. T. K. MacLellan, seconded by Mr. Beane, it was agreed to extend to Mr. Webster on his retirement from the Convener's office of the Synod's committee on missions, after three years of diligent and highly satisfactory service, the Synod's sincere thanks.
