## Practical Fashion Hints

Rich and elaborate materials are not favored for small frocks and suits. Fabrics are occasionally introduced for a coat or dress, and crepe de Chine is used a great deal for more dressy wear, but as a rule wash materials are considered better than anything else. It is pleasing and new to belt in the long-waisted frock of white or colored tulle, pique or crepe, with black velvet; colored sashes are also seen.

No. 7758 is a long-waisted design, closing on the left side, with a low-shaped belt and with a three piece skirt attached to a separate underwaist. This little dress could be developed successfully in linen, pique or serge. If a dark serge is used, an effective way of introducing a bit of color is in the buttons, which may be of red or varicolored bone.

For a child of 12 this dress requires 8 1/2 yards of 36 inch material, with 1/2 yard of lining for the underwaist. The pattern is cut in 4 sizes; 8 to 14. This is a Perfect Pattern. ### CLAIM BENTON WAS GIVEN TRIAL

(Canadian Press.)  
EL PASO, Feb. 22—The record of the Court Martial on Wm. S. Benton was made public at Juarez this afternoon. It asserts that the Scotchman was present and was represented by a rebel officer as Attorney. He was able to testify at the session which was public. He was executed for attempted violence against Villa, having been found guilty of giving aid and comfort to the enemy with storage cattle.

Benton's friends received this report with amazement. They pointed out that to their knowledge of many years that he never carried a pistol, as a guard to himself against serious results of his bad temper. The statement that Benton was allowed to testify and that the proceedings were public, carried no conviction with his friends who state that Benton was murdered. The accused, says the report, was arraigned, having been advised to have someone to defend him, Captain Mariano Tames was designated for the purpose, and he was warned to defend the prisoner loyally. There is no further word of the Captain in the report.

The witnesses against Benton were Major Banda and Adolfo Farías. It does not appear that Villa testified. The witnesses swore that Benton called on Villa Tuesday afternoon, at an

inopportune moment. The witnesses said that Benton made a complaint of rebel depredations on his ranch at Lorremedias in the State of Chihuahua and asked permission to return to it.
