**Concrete Bridge At Summerside Now Completed**

**Substantial New Structure Adds Much to Convenience of General Public In Prince County Capital**

The new concrete bridge at the eastern approach to Summerside was completed this week. It is a substantial solid structure and should last for years. The road will not be open for traffic for a few days as the roadbed on each side has to be graded up level with the bridge, which is built up in anticipation of the concrete road being continued through from the Summerside side to the Govern-

ment concrete road. This, however, cannot be done for about twelve months after the bridge has been made. The town of Summerside will complete their section next year and in all probability the Government will do the same. If as is anticipated the Government decide to concrete the highway to Read's Corner the approach to Summerside from the east would be one of the best sections of road in the Province. S.

**MIGRATORY BIRDS ACT**

**Summary Of Federal Regulations Affecting This Province.**

The National Parks Service of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, has just issued the Regulations regarding Migratory Birds for the current year.

A summary of the Regulations as they apply to Prince Edward Island follows:

**OPEN SEASONS**

Both dates inclusive:  
Ducks, Geese, Brant, Coots and Rails: Sept. 1-Dec. 14.  
Woodcock, Wilson's or Jack-snipe: Sept. 15-Nov. 30.

**CLOSED SEASONS**

There is a closed season throughout the year on Wood Ducks, Swans, Cranes, Curlew, Willets, Godwits, Upland Plover, Black-bellied and Golden Plover, Greater and Lesser Yellow-legs, Avocets, Dowitchers, Knots, Oyster-catchers, Phalaropes, Scaups, Surf-birds, Turnstones and all the shore birds not provided with an open season in above schedule.

There is a closed season throughout the year on the following non-game birds:  
Auklets, Kittiwakes, Fulmars, Gannets, Grebes, Guillemots, Gulls, Herons, Jaegers, Loons, Murrelets, Petrels, Puffins, Shearwaters and Terns; and there is a closed season throughout the year on the following insectivorous birds: Bobolinks, Catbirds, Chickadees, Cuckoos, Flickers, Flycatchers, Grosbeaks, Hummingbirds, Kinglets, Martins, Meadowlarks, Nighthawks or Bull-hats, Nuthatches, Orioles, Robins, Shrikes, Swallows, Swifts, Tanagers, Titmice, Thrushes, Vireos, Warblers, Waxwings, Whip-poor-wills, Woodpeckers, and Wrens, and all other perching birds which feed entirely or chiefly on insects.

No person shall kill, hunt, capture, injure, take or molest any migratory game birds during the closed season; and no person shall sell, expose for sale, offer for sale, buy, trade or traffic in any migratory game bird at any time.

The taking of the nests or eggs of migratory game, migratory insectivorous and migratory non-game birds is prohibited.

The killing, hunting, capturing, taking or molesting of migratory insectivorous and migratory non-game birds, their nests or eggs is prohibited.

The possession of migratory game birds killed during the open season is allowed in Prince Edward Island until January 31 following open season.

**BAG LIMITS**

Ducks 15, Geese 15, Brant 15, Rails Coots and Gallinules 25 in the aggregate, Wilson's or Jack-snipe 25, Woodcock 8, and not more than 125 Woodcock in one season.

**GUNS AND APPLIANCES**

The use of automatic (auto-loading), swivel, or machine guns, or battery, or any gun larger than number 10 gauge is prohibited, and the use of any aeroplane, powerboat, sail boat, wounded live birds as decoys, night light, and shooting from any horse-drawn or motor vehicle is forbidden.

The penalty for violation of the Migratory Bird laws is a fine of not more than three hundred dollars and not less than ten dollars, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or both fine and imprisonment.
