THE SUNDAY ACT.

In a signed statement sent to the press Rev. J. G. Shearer indicates what from the view point of the Lord's Day Alliance is the scope and value of the new Lord's Day Act just passed by the Parliament of Canada. At the outset Mr. Shearer says: "We have not secured all we sought, but on the whole it is a good Act. It is an immense gain over what we had before."

He proceeds to show that it is a very great advantage that we now have one law on the subject for the whole Dominion, which recognises the Lord's Day as a national institution, and which makes all trading or work on that day, except works of necessity or mercy unlawful. It prohibits all Sunday theatres and public games, sports or amusements for gain, or prize or reward. It banishes the Sunday newspaper. It applies to companies or corporations as well as to individuals with graduated penalties—one to forty dollars for the workman, twenty to one hundred dollars for a person who is an employer and fifty to five hundred dollars for a corporate company.

The new Act applies to all farmers, artisans or professional men alike. No man may labor at or follow his regular calling, be he laborer, mechanic, lawyer or merchant, unless it be for the time a work of mercy or necessity. Again the new Act applies to the great interprovincial transportation companies, which no merely provincial Act could touch. They were free to carry on all forms of transportation and construction or repair work. Under the new law they are not free to carry excursions, or to make up and start out freight trains, or to unload freight trains except in emergent circumstances, or to carry on construction or general repairs, or work their office staff.

Again, the new Act secures to every worker the right of one day's rest in seven. It compelled to work on Sunday, as in street cars, telegraph or telephone work, the worker must have twenty-four consecutive hours of rest on another day of the week. These are the more salient features of the Act. An amendment put in by the Senate provides that in the consent of the Attorney General of the Province must be obtained for any prosecution under the Act. This, we think, a regrettable restriction, although ostensibly designed to prevent vexatious prosecutions. Much will depend upon the attitude of the provincial law officers as to the efficiency of enforcement.

FREIGHT ON CH

The cheese industry is of vast importance to this Province and ought to be fostered and encouraged in every reason way. Complaint is made that it is unduly handicapped by the increased freight rates on the Island Railway. The Patriot, which is an ardent supporter of the party in power, shows how great the increase has been. Among other things it says:

"The freight rates (on cheese) between Emerald and Charlottetown, and Perth and Charlottetown have been advanced 50 per cent; between Kensington and Charlottetown 110 per cent, and between Tignish and Charlottetown 117 per cent." These are startling changes and they appear very unequal as relates to different stations on the railway. Surely there is something behind these disproportionate increases of freight rates that calls for explanation.

We are aware that there has been a general advance in freight on the railway with a view to bringing the receipts as nearly as may be up to the working expenses. Can it be that this general advance ranges from 56 1/2 per cent, as in the case of cheese? If so, our farmers are up against a very stiff proposition indeed. And, if the general advance has not been so great as this we are still at a loss to know why the cheese industry should be singled out for this new and extraordinary burden.

Behind this is the larger question of why the Government canals should be operated entirely free of tolls, at a yearly loss of a million or more, while the Government railway doubles its former rates of freight. Things must be pretty bad when the recognized organ of the Government cries out against them. We trust these matters will be thoroughly sifted and adjusted upon a more satisfactory basis when Deputy Minister Butler comes and gives a hearing to the aggrieved shippers.

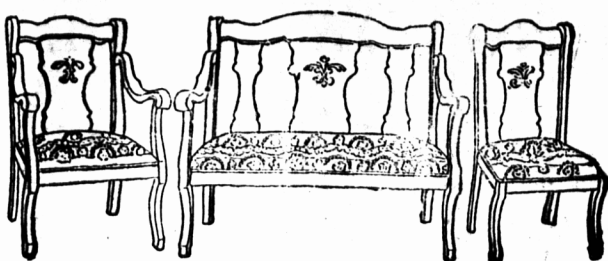
