The Canadian Amateur Skating Association has decided to break its compact with the National Skating Association for holding American championships alternately in Canada and the United States. At a meeting Wednesday it was decided to hold the Canadian championships in Montreal, Feb. 4.

REV. W. A. THOMSON has accepted the call to the pastorate of the Methodist church at Campbellton next July. Rev. H. E. Thomas, the present pastor, will have finished four years on that circuit, the limit allowed by the discipline of the church, and has accepted a call to the Wesley Memorial church at Moncton.

The foreign mail was despatched by the Minto yesterday at one o'clock for Pictou. This included all the western mail, except closed bags, that would arrive in Charlottetown up till this forenoon. The C. P. R. mail that would have arrived in summer last night will reach here to-day about eleven o'clock by the Minto which returns to Pictou again to-morrow morning.

The Fruit Division Ottawa will make an exhibit of fruit from all the provinces of Canada, also a full line of horticultural implements. There will be an interesting address and discussion on co-operation in the packing and marketing of fruit. All are invited to co-operate to make the meeting and Fruit Show a grand success.

The annual meeting of the Bloomsfield Farmers' Institute was held in the St. Anthony's hall recently. There was a fairly good attendance of members. President C. H. Carruthers occupied the chair. The Secretary showed the Institute to be in a healthy condition having eighty members on the roll. They imported \$130.00 worth of seed and placed \$187.00 worth of improved stock during the year and had a good balance to credit. The Bangor Daily Commercial's recent article on the Anroostok County's great potato crop and the potato houses in which they are kept. If all these potato houses were placed end to end they would have a total length of 13,051 feet, and would make a building two and one half miles long. The 27 houses in the list have a total capacity of 2,284,112 bushels. If their contents were shipped at one time, 4576 cars would be required to contain them, meaning a train more than 31 miles long, not to speak of the engines that would be required to haul it. The capacity of these houses does not represent anything like the total crop of potatoes raised in Anroostok annually. Perhaps one-fourth of the potatoes are put into the houses along the line of the railroad and millions of bushels are taken directly from the fields and shipped out of the state. A large part of the potatoes put into these houses are not taken out until way along in the spring and they are never taken out until they are used for seed, for thousands of bushels are required to plant the fields for another crop. This immense crop was dug almost entirely by the Hoover Potato Digger, a sample of which was shown at the Provincial Exhibition by the agent W. W. Lounsbury, Ashland, Me.

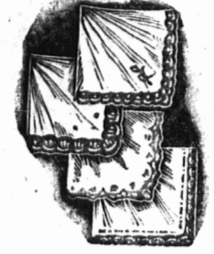

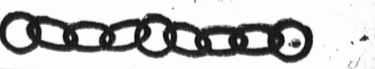
