## ATTENDANCE ROLL FOR MEMBERS.

Mr. Bourassa, leader of the Opposition in Ottawa, thinks it desirable that a daily report shall be kept of the attendance of members in the House. This would seem to be necessary in both Houses according to a "black list" submitted by Mr. Bourassa. Mr. Bourassa pointed out that as the law now stands a member who is only in attendance during a few days can still draw half or more of his \$2,000 indemnity. He read a list of members in Ottawa. Despatch talks, who were absent last session half or two-thirds of the session and draw an indemnity sufficient to make \$200 or more each day they were actually present in the House. Of course those who attended regularly drew more than \$200 per day. Mr. Bourassa said, we are told culminated with Senator Cox who attended five days and drew \$200 per day. He proposed an amendment which was not adopted. That members who attended less than two-thirds of the session should receive not more than \$1 a day.

It transpired during the discussion that many members who are in or about Ottawa are by no means constant in their attendance upon the sittings of the Senate or House. A few members attended in some manner the morning of the morning session for a day's attendance. Mr. Bourassa called attention to this practice as one of the greater evils. It seems that the House is indemnity members receive the less attention they pay to their public duties. By all means let a record be kept of actual attendance at the two Houses.

The Imperial House of Commons has lost one of its brightest men in Sir Wilfrid Lawson, and at the same time the Temperance cause has lost an able and energetic advocate.

Mr. Barwick was head of the great law firm in Toronto of which Mr. Aylesworth is a member, and from their early days in professional life they had been closely associated. A Toronto telegram to the Montreal Herald, however, intimates that Mr. Aylesworth will remain in the cabinet as Minister of Justice.

## EGYPTIANS HAD TO PAY PENALTY

CAIRO, July 7.—The sentences imposed upon natives for the attack upon officers of the Imperial Guard on June 13, when Captain Bull was killed, were carried out Friday on the road close to the scene of the attack. A stone about sixty yards by thirty was set off for the gallows. A whipping post was fixed in the centre of this space, which was surrounded by troops. One man was hanged and then two were flogged beneath the swinging body. The process was repeated until all the sentences were executed. Hundreds of natives watched the scene, the women weeping loudly. All the victims faced death and flogging calmly.


