WILD MAN LIVING ON VANCOUVER ISLAND

An Old Tradition of Man-Beast is Apparently Verified by the Testimony of Four Men Who Claim to Have Seen the Monster.

Victoria, B. C., Jan. 9.—The Vancouver Island wild man, whose existence has been prominent in the traditions of the island tribes and who has been vouched for by "Mike" King, a famous backwoodsman has again made his appearance, and this time there were four witnesses.

A. B. Crump, J. Kinkaid, T. Hutchins, and W. T. Buss of Qualicum, say they were out hunting near Horne's Lake, in an uninhabited section, when they came upon the uncouth being on the lake shore. He ran like a deer through the tangle of undergrowth, and pursuit was impracticable.

The wild man was apparently young, with long and matted hair and beard, and was covered with a profusion of hair all over the body.

It was four years since King came across the strange being. He was prospecting the timber country inland from the head of Camp'ell River, his Indians having

the country of the "massache ikta"—literally "the bad thing." It was toward evening and the man-beast was surprised while bending over a water hole, washing certain edible roots which he had disposed in two piles, the one cleaned and the other awaiting cleaning.

At Mr. King's approach the creature started a cry of mingled terror, astonishment and defiance, then ran half way up the hillside, where he stood for five minutes, curiously regarding the intruder. Mr King's description was very similar to that given by the Qualicum quartet.

The Indians in Northern Vancouver Island shun what has been set apart by them as the country of the "massache ikta" and no persuasion will induce them to go into it with hunter, trapper or prospector. Their tradition is that at the coming of the Spaniards to the west coast an immense monkey escaped from a vessel and took refuge in the forest wilderness. Several months later it appeared and caught up and

A GIRL OF FIFTEEN. The natives allege that two wild children resulted, but that one was found dead in a rude hut beyond the headwaters of Campbell River, leaving at least one other creature to roam the woods.

Old prospectors tell of glimpses of the wild man as far back as 1865, when a mining man named Brown contributed to the Victoria Colonial an account of his adventures as the result of the desertion of his Murchalal Indians in terror during an ascent of Gold River.

The Qualicum settlers say that half a dozen times during the last few years reports have come to the settlements of such a creature being seen, but as the truth of the encounter depended upon one or, at most, two witnesses, the stories have been scouted.

A new theory at Qualicum connects the wild man with the fact that nine years ago a child strayed into the forests and never again emerged. They incline to the belief that this child has lived, succored perhaps by the beasts, and is the wild man of to-day.
