ASTROLOGY AND POLITICS—A STORM COMING.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier has precipitated a general election at the time of the autumnal equinox; and on "the old moon." Where, oh where, was the Government astrologer when the fateful date was fixed? Every one has heard of the violence of equinoctial storms and gales. What farmer does not know how pork shrinks when it is killed while the moon is on the wane? What if majorities should also shrink? And what is had for the pork cannot be good for the political pigs that have been at the trough for so many moons past.

Well, whatever Old Probs may say the day before, there will be a genuine equinoctial gale in Canada on the 21st of September. It will follow upon rather unsettled political weather throughout the Dominion for some weeks previous. The gale will begin at precisely nine o'clock in the morning in the Maritime Provinces and will sweep westward over the whole of Canada, reaching the Pacific coast about 1 o'clock p. m., of our time. It will continue for eight hours and will be accompanied with a very heavy precipitation—of ballots!

So much we are tolerably sure of. Only once before in all our federal history was an election held so near the autumnal equinox. That was on September 17, 1878, when many of the tall oaks and maples of the political forest were laid low. And Mackenzie had given a four days' leeway to the equinox, and we are not sure that the moon had waned so much as it will have on the fated 21st of September this year.

All of which is nonsense, of course. Did not Sir Charles Tupper appeal to the electors just two days after the longest day—June 23, 1896—and came to grief, despite the sun just turning south and a new moon growing in the sky? A fig for astrology. It is a wholly discredited relic of the days of superstition and ignorance. All the same The Guardian's confident prediction will prove true—there will be a mighty political storm in Canada on September 21, and it will blow down a part of the rickety, old tariff wall, so much the better. And we think it will.

BRITAIN NOT DECADENT.

It will be remembered that some months ago the Canadian Government appointed a Royal Commission on Industrial Training and Technical Education. Its object is to visit the different progressive nations and gather information which might afford a guide in developing industrial and technical training in Canada. Our old friend Dr. James Robertson is Chairman of the Commission, which has already visited the foremost European countries and is now in the United Kingdom. The other day the Commission visited the Department of Applied Science in Sheffield University and the Sheffield Independent gives an account of the visit.

Some remarks made by Dr. Robertson at the luncheon given the visitors are worthy of repetition. Who has not heard that Britain is behind hand and decadent? Dr. Robertson told them the English did not appreciate their country at anything like its full value, the really good things they had in education and the really marvellous progress they had made in ten years. "Having come," he said, "from a tour through France, Switzerland, Germany and Belgium he could say that in his judgment England had no reason to feel dissatisfied with her own position."

Duty Swept Away Where the Prince Edward Island Farmer Gains

Farmers, market gardeners and horticulturists in particular, will do well to keep in mind the figures of the following tables. They exhibit the changes made in the United States tariff on a large number of natural products:

This great sweeping away of duties by the United States, if accepted by the people of Canada, as it surely will be, will mean hundreds of thousands of dollars to the producers of Prince Edward Island. If a farmer is making a comfortable living now, will be heard without a laugh the voice of the Tory orator, speaking in behalf of the Big Cities and the Big Interests, who tells him to "let well enough alone" and refuse the proffer of an extra gain undreamed of before last winter?

From Guardian August 9th A COMMON-SENSE VIEW.

It is the common fault of party advocates both in the press and on the platform, especially at election times that they express extreme views. The discussion of reciprocity affords an instance of this. Reciprocity may, and we believe it will prove a very good thing for Prince Edward Island, without immediately making every one rich. It may in some minor respects prove detrimental to individual interests and yet on the whole prove beneficial. Its essential feature is that it removes some serious obstacles to trade and leaves our people much more free than they have been as to their choice of markets in which to sell and buy.

The so-called "protection" which it was claimed the national policy gave to the farmer, reciprocity takes away by giving practical free trade in farm products. But we are of those who believe that this so-called protection to the farmer was a sham and never of any practical benefit to him. As to the benefit to our farmers from the removal of United States duties on our farm products, it would be rash to assume that the amount of the duty will all be added to the price which our farmers will receive. If that were true the American consumer would receive no benefit. The instances are few in which the consumer does not pay a large share of the duty, and hence he may be expected to gain by the removal of the duty.

The inevitable effect of the removal of duties from farm products by the United States and Canada will be to equalize prices on both sides of the boundary. The American market being the larger in the proportion of ten to one, will be the dominating factor in that regard. It is in the main a higher market than that of Canada, but not in all things. We stand to gain if it remains a better market than our own, and The Guardian believes it will so remain. In the United States manufacturing is developing much faster than agricultural production. In Canada the reverse of this is true, notably in the Northwest.
