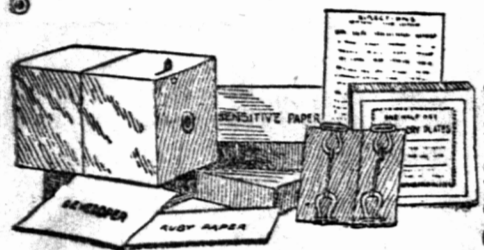

MR. S. H. JONES will ship 840 lambs for the Boston market this morning. He has secured all the available space on the Northumberland for the remainder of this week and will make large shipments every day during that time.

MR. S. H. JONES has shipped to date from this port to Boston 4,660 lambs, and has now on hand 3,500 waiting for cars at Point du Chene. He is forwarding in the Northumberland this morning 320 fat sheep in bond to Boston for Liverpool.

THE Steamer City of Ghent arrived here from Halifax Saturday morning with a fair freight. She left on return at 6 o'clock taking away 100 dressed hogs, 76 boxes cheese, 53 cases lobsters, 180 bags potatoes and oats, 142 bales hides and a quantity of sundries.

DR. JAS. McDONALD, V.S., performed a skilful operation last Thursday on a valuable horse owned by McDonald Howat of Cape Traverse. The animal had for a year and a half been almost completely crippled by Ring bone from which it suffered severely. After being chloroformed, the operation consisted in cutting over the nerve conveying sensation to the affected part and removing a section of it. When dressed and bandaged the horse appeared to have received complete relief and has not yet shown any signs of lameness. Dr. J. H. McLellan administered the chloroform and witnessed the operation.

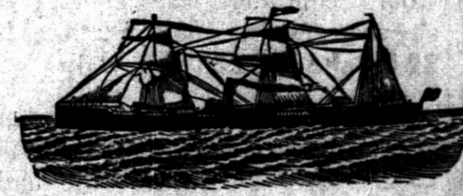

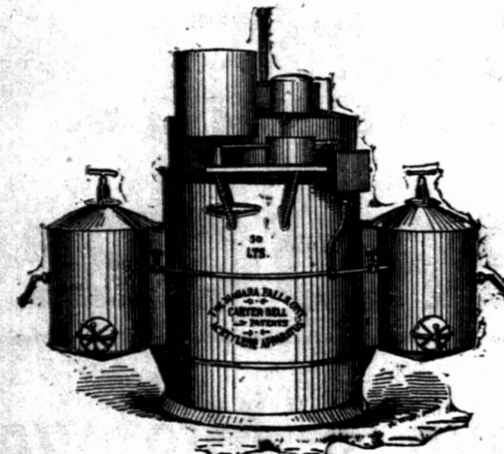

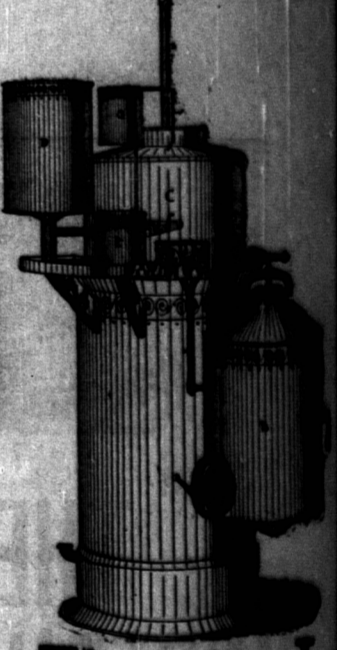
