Up-Swing In Montreal Stocks; Toronto Quiet
MONTREAL, March 23—(CP)—A general up-swing was noted among industrials and mining stocks on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market today.
The sudden upturn—a favorable reaction to the 1949 Canadian Government budget—came after weeks of dull marketing here.
Most leaders followed a similar firmer tendency displayed on Wall Street this morning.
The improved tone on the New York exchange also was reported since import restrictions on some United States commodities were eased further.
Gains were fractional in most instances although a few leaders added more than two points in spots.
Trading also was improved with turnovers at approximately 40,000 industrials and 264,200 mining and western oil shares, against respective total of 22,400 and 190,500 shares Tuesday.
Closing average indicated banks ahead 1 1/2, utilities 3/4, industrial 1 1/2, and golds .05. Papers made the best showing jumping 10.35 to 318.43.
