power of the Catholic Church. It is with the deepest regret we learn of his withdrawal from the high official position he so usefully and honorably filled."

These seem broad and liberal views, but they did not find approval with the Reverend Doctor's superior, the Bishop of the diocese, who somewhat peremptorily demanded his resignation. The Bishop held that the pronouncement was one that ought not to have been made, and that the offence was aggravated by the priest having given his discourse to the press for publication.

From the general public point of view the offence would not seem to be very great. No one outside its pale would however venture to criticize too severely the exercise of discipline within any one of the churches. Each has its own methods.

There are bishops and bishops in both the Protestant and Catholic Churches, not all of whom are equally tolerant and charitable. Much of the bitterness of past sectarian differences and warfare has happily passed away. What remains of it could well be spared.

THE CONFLICT BETWEEN LORDS AND COMMONS.

General and profound regret will be felt that the conference between the leaders of the opposing parties in the United Kingdom over the veto power of the Lords has failed. It is not surprising, however that it did fail. It would have been more surprising had it succeeded. The two parties are

wide apart, and there is no clearly visible middle ground upon which they could agree.

It is understood that the King greatly desired, that the conference should be held, if he did not suggest it, and that more strongly still he desired that the conference might re-

sult in an agreement. A very large number of the British people also desired a peaceful settlement of the complicated questions at issue. But the short truce has ended and the party war will be at once resumed.

It is easy to guess that what the Opposition leaders and the Lords would not accept in conference they will not accept when formulated as the demand of the popular Chamber. The Lords are willing to accept, and have indeed proposed a considerable measure of reform in the constitution of their ancient House.

The questions at issue must in the end be submitted to the people as the court of last resort, the people, whose settled will in democratic countries is the supreme law. The conference has failed; the King cannot settle the dispute, will not settle it, in the only way that his present advisers propose, which is by the appointment of hundreds of new Peers. It must go to the people.

AS TO HINDOO IMMIGRATION.

A Hindoo from British India, a subject of the King, came to Vancouver as a tourist, but once there decided to remain and engaged in business. Had he been an American, German, Frenchman, Italian, Russian or other foreigner he might have done this without let or hindrance. But it is proposed to deport the Hindoo because he came from Asia and not by a direct route.

It appears there is a regulation in Canada that prohibits Asiatics, other than Chinese and Japanese, from entering Canada to reside there, unless they come direct from their native land. The particular Hindoo above referred to came to Canada from India by way of Honolulu.

It is inevitable that any harsh or unjust treatment of the Hindoos in Canada must react by creating further discontent in India. These people are intelligent, and are endowed with a strong sense of justice.

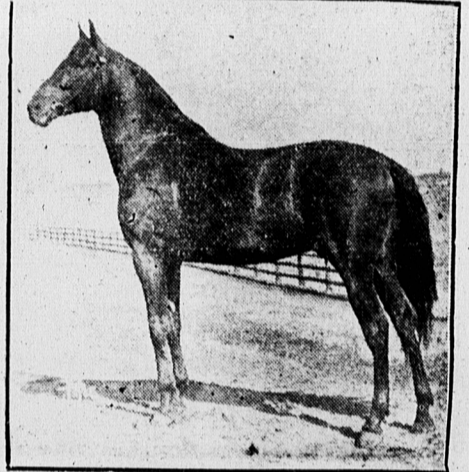

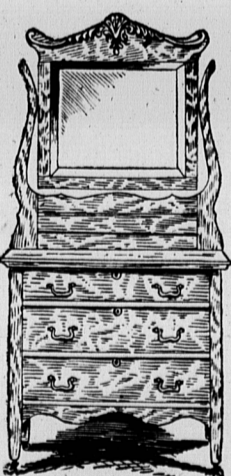
