STOCK QUOTATIONS

Stock Markets At A Glance

NEW YORK, June 21 (AP) - The New York Stock Exchange announced today that the board of governors had voted to close the market on Saturdays during July and August and on Sept. 1, the Saturday before Labor Day. (The Toronto and Montreal Stock Exchanges have been closed Saturday throughout the summer.)

CHICAGO, June 21 (AP) - Grain markets rallied today after an early sell-off had caused important losses and at the finish most of the futures list was substantially higher.

WINNIPEG, June 21 (CP) - No export business in wheat or coarse grain was reported on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today. In the domestic market shippers and exporters continued to make purchases of oats but offerings continued high.

TORONTO, June 21 (CP) - The Toronto Stock Market ruffled an index gain for the Western Oil Stocks in today's session and other groups closed with moderate losses. There were no features in the gold share trade and the volume for the group was down.

NEW YORK, June 21 (AP) - Gains of fractions to 3 points and new highs for the past eight years or longer were widespread in today's Stock Market with dealings among the liveliest of 1945.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 1/4 of a point at 78.6, a top since Aug. 21, 1937. The utilities also touched a high since that date while the rails established a peak since May 10, 1937.

MONTREAL, June 21 (CP) - Papers and leaders in other groups gave a rising display today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market.

Papers, which backed up generally on Wednesday as a reflection to rumors, since unofficially denied, that the Canadian dollar would be placed on a parity with the United States exchange, swung back sharply and most of the losses were retrieved. C.P.R., in sympathy with Wall Street, rose 3/4 of a point to its best level since 1933. Winnipeg electric common and preferred and Power Corporation in utilities were each up more than 2 to new highs. Brokers reported a short supply of the stocks had developed.

Trading book notes: total sales, 37,220 shares; mines higher 69; industrials 81,400; stocks higher 69; lower 39; unchanged 63.
