WAR VETERAN INJURED.—Corporal I. W. Ellis of O'Leary, who arrived in Charlottetown this week from Overseas being one of the men who came out on the S. S. Belgic, enlisted in 1915. He was one of the first men who volunteered in the 82nd Battalion but was not accepted at the time, but left later with the 105th. He transferred afterwards to the 124th Battalion, but only remained with that regiment three weeks. He then went into the first Canadian Engineers Battalion and remained with them in France to the finish of the war. He went through the campaign without receiving any injury. On his way to Canada on the Belgic he however had the misfortune to meet with a painful accident; a fire extinguisher in some way falling from a wall and striking him on the head making an ugly wound while some of the chemical contents got into his eyes causing the lids to swell and almost closing both eyes. Corp. Ellis was obliged to undergo treatment upon his arrival at the Convalescent Home. He left for O'Leary yesterday afternoon.
