RUSSIA WATCHING TURKISH ADVANCE

MOSCOW, Sept. 26.—Although the Soviets deny the report, originating from French sources in Constantinople, that Russian and Roumanian troops have been heavily engaged on that frontier, no denial is made of the acute Russian interest in the Turkish-Greek war, which in some quarters here, is regarded as the prelude to an other great European conflict. What Russia fears most is that her two enemies, Roumania and Poland will combine against her. At the same time Russia is boasting of the Turks as her own protectors. Maps of Angora and its surroundings are being sold in the street cars here, and war news is splashed all over the ordinary heavy Russian newspapers. Russia has officially extended her moral support to the Turks, although it is denied that she has given any real material support. The Roumanian-Bessarabian front has been a sore spot for some time, and there have been constant reports of friction on that border. Leo Kameneff, Trotsky's adjutant, has been down for an inspection of the Roumanian frontier, but unless the situation there has changed within the last few days, which is regarded as doubtful, these reports of "heavy engagements" are based on desultory border warfare and Russian attacks on the bandits and counter-revolutionaries who were in the Ukraine and are now under Roumanian's wing. Russia is watching the Turkish advance with more interest because of Russian interest in Constantinople and the Dardanelles.

She will demand of Turkey that she participate in any conference that decides any issue that hinges on these two questions. At the same time, Russia is keeping a watchful eye on troublesome Roumanian and Poland, who, Russia fears, will attack her if they are encouraged by the prospect of an international conflict, which Russian observers regard as possible.

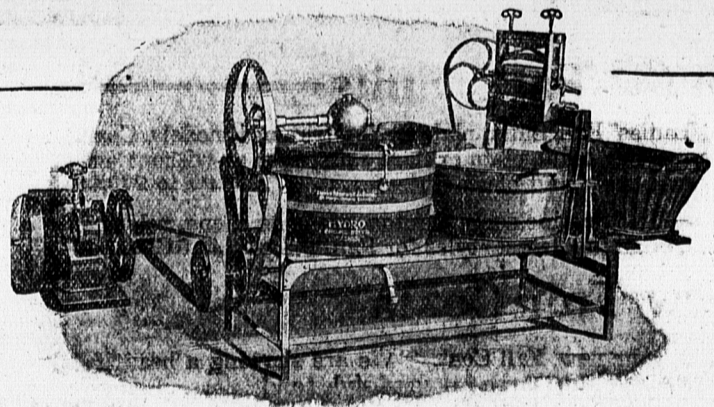
