### ENGLAND AND JAPAN.

(Brooklyn Eagle.)

On January 30, 1902, the Marquis of Lansdowne, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs in the British Cabinet, and Baron Hayashi, Japanese Minister to London, signed for their respective governments a treaty of alliance. On February 12 following the terms of that treaty were published without reserve. They included a mutual assertion of interest in China and a specific declaration by Japan of her peculiar relation to Korea. Each signatory pledged neutrality when the other became involved in war for the protection of its interests, but the neutrality was not to be maintained when either Japan or England was embroiled with more than one antagonist. In that event forces were to be combined for defensive and offensive operations.

The treaty, expires by limitation January 30, 1907. Report resting on credible authority has it that Japan and her ally had already canceled the agreement by a new and more comprehensive document, which is to be published as soon as the treaty of peace is signed. Whether this be true or otherwise, there is not the slightest doubt that the alliance will be renewed and that, renewed, it will exert a tremendous influence upon the whole trend of Asiatic politics. Japan found the present treaty of some value in the war with Russia and will regard the renewal or enlargement of its terms as a very substantial guarantee that her commercial progress in Korea and Manchuria will not be interfered with. England has already used the Japanese league as a bulwark to her own colonial position in China, reducing her Asiatic fleet and in other ways curtailing her expenditures for defense.

It is said that the next treaty will draw the bonds tighter by pledging either signatory to help the other even in cases where but a single adversary has to be encountered. A bargain of that nature is probable because of the distinct advantages to be derived by both sides. It would forever preclude any attempt by Russia to recover her lost prestige in China. It would likewise relieve the Indian frontier of the dread, always imminent, while the Bear continues his steady march through Persia to Herat and Kabul. England can render invaluable assistance to Japan on the sea. Japan can render invaluable assistance to England on land. A war of revenge in Manchuria or in Korea would take British armoured vessels to the Baltic. A descent upon the Himalayan passes would call for a Japanese army to sustain the Gurkhas and the Sikhs. Russia would think long before she challenged the alliance in either quarter, and, except Russia, no other European power need be seriously taken into account as a disturbing factor in the East.

Offensive and defensive alliances make for peace. That has been the case with alliance between France and Russia and the now crumbling alliance between Germany, Austria and Italy. That will be the case with the new Anglo-Japanese alliance. International politics requires a nice adjustment of weights and balances if the machine is to move without friction. War becomes impossible or suicidal the moment aggressive nations are made aware that the opposition to be encountered by them possesses an over-

Together they have an authority that cannot be disputed and together they may be expected to exert it to encourage the peaceful progress so much desired by both. Allied they are too formidable to be attacked. And because they are too formidable to be attacked they will make peace a reasonably permanent quantity in Asia.

### MOUNT ALLISON.

Fourth Story University Residence Finished—Other Improvements.

The work of internally completing the fourth story of the University Residence and preparing it for the occupation of students is now practically completed. The systems of electric lighting and hot water heating in use in the lower stories have been extended upwards. The painters are putting their finishing touch on the carpenter's work, which, with the exception of the stairways, is now finished. Students fortunate enough to be located on this floor will enjoy in addition to most elegant and spacious quarters an outlook of unsurpassed sweep and beauty. Advantage has been taken of the occasion to increase the radiating surface in some of the more exposed rooms in the lower floors. In the Science Building new floors are being laid in the principal lecture rooms. A new room is being fitted up to provide more accommodation for the classes in drawing and descriptive geometry. Valuable additions are being made to the philosophical apparatus and mechanical outfit. It is expected that within a few days the occupant of the new chair in civil engineering will be announced. In both Arts and Science a largely increased registration is looked for while there will be a considerable augmentation in the department of Theology also. Students who wish to secure rooms in the Residence will do well to make application without delay.
