PORES SHOW IDENTITY

That your pores will tell who you are is the assertion of Dr. Edmond Locard, Director of the Police Laboratory at Lyons, France.

The number of pores in a given area of skin remains the same throughout life.

Pores are sometimes grouped so as to form the three corners of a triangle, sometimes as the four corners of a square and sometimes they are in a haphazard fashion.

The distance between pores, though they differ in individuals, always average the same in the skin of any one person.

Doctor Locard claims for his new method of identification the advantage over the finger print system that in the latter it is necessary to have an imprint showing a good part of a finger end, while in the former all that is needed is an imprint of only a minute patch of skin.

There was recently a burglary

in Paris which baffled the detectives, because the burglar had worked with gloved hands and had come and gone without any human having seen him.

The application of the old finger print system, was impossible here, but Doctor Locard noticed that



an imprint of a bit of the burglar's skin—that part which was exposed where the glove bottomed—was present.

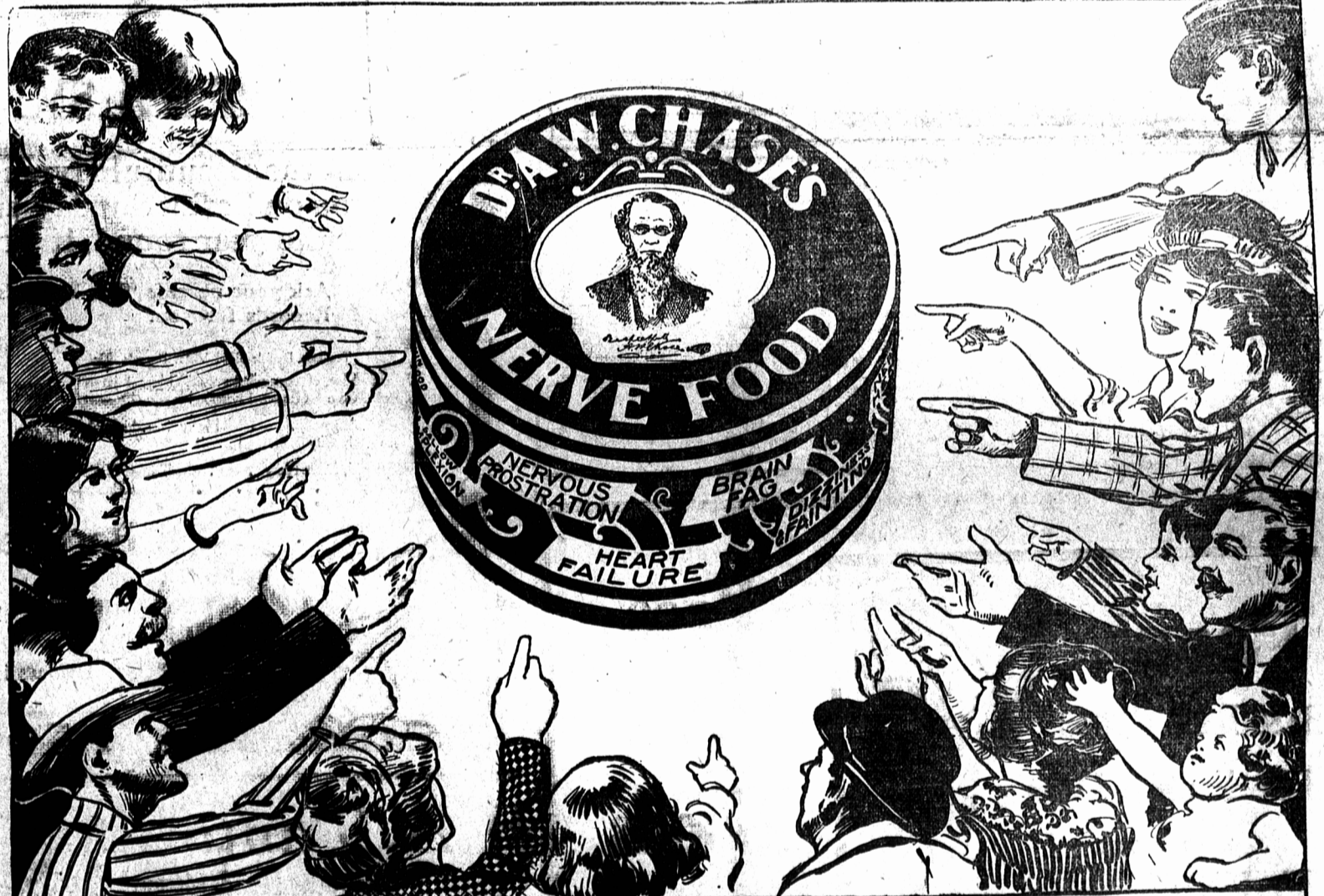
Mail Contract
