The Canadians were received at the British Embassy and the whole delegation at the White House.

Gaskell's Cranford. Edited by Charles Elbert Rhodes, A. M., Department of English, Lafayette High School, Buffalo, N. Y. Cloth, 16mo, 312 pages, with portrait. Price, 40 cents. American Book Company New York, Cincinnati, and Chicago. This is the latest volume of the Gateway Series of English Texts, under the general editorship of Professor Henry van Dyke. It carries out well the purpose of the series to make the text clear, interesting, and helpful to those beginning the study of literature, and to supply the knowledge which the student needs to pass the entrance examination in English for the colleges. The Introduction gives a brief sketch of Mrs. Gaskell's life, and an outline of Cranford sufficient to enable the student to enter into the spirit of this celebrated book. The notes treat all allusions that need explanation; and a series of suggestive questions for review follows the notes.
