BALLOONING SEASON OPENS.

HADLEY, April 21—A trip of 17 miles from Springfield to this town today marked the opening of the balloon season in New England, the balloon Springfield launching here at 4:30 P.M. on a farm. In the basket were A. Holland Forbes, pilot, and John Parker and William Hull, members of the New York Yacht Club.

The ascension was made at Springfield at 3.25. The high wind and extra ballast threatened for a few moments to make it unpleasant.

The balloon rose but a few feet, then rolled close to the ground, until it struck a tree, branches and twigs being torn off and caught in the netting. A second tree was touched and only rapid work in throwing out ballast allowed the aeronauts to clear a four-story apartment house.

The highest elevation reached was 6200 feet. It was the first trip for Parker and Hull.

IMMIGRATION LAST YEAR FROM THE STATES

OTTAWA, April 23—During the fiscal year just ended, 103,798 immigrants from the United States settled in Canada. This is practically half of the total immigration into the country during the year which was 208,794. It is nearly double that of the previous year.

The total immigration into Canada during March, 22,065 persons, was the largest for any single month in the history of Canadian immigration.

SHOCKING MURDER ON ONTARIO FARM.

BROCKVILLE, April 21—This morning at eleven o'clock a murder was committed on a farm near Cardinal. Nathan Bolton, a highly respected farmer, between 55 and 60 years of age, was killed with an axe by Albert Holmes, an equally respected man, and one who held the esteem of all in the community.

About two months ago Holmes purchased a farm from Bolton. Yesterday at the Holmes' farm some pigs were killed and Bolton assisted in the work with Holmes and another neighbor. This morning Bolton went to Holmes' to help to cut up the animals, and while the work was going on was cut down by an axe in the hands of Holmes. He was cut in two places about the head. One blow cut through his cap into the skull, and another was just behind the right ear. The gasp made was such as killed the man instantly.

HALIFAX IS NOT ENTHUSIASTIC

HALIFAX, April 23—Only twenty-seven citizens attended the meeting called by Mayor Chisholm to consider the celebration of the arrival of the first Canadian warship at Halifax. There was absolutely no enthusiasm.

34,000 PASSENGERS LANDED

HALIFAX, April 23—The arrival of the Victorian from Liverpool, with fifteen hundred passengers marked the close of the winter season.

From now the mail boats will run up the St. Lawrence. During winter months, more than 34,000 passengers across the Atlantic were brought to this port by four of the steamship lines.

CLOSE OF N. S. LEGISLATURE

HALIFAX, April 23—The Legislature of Nova Scotia closed yesterday. The most important bills passed during the session was that providing for Provincial Prohibition outside of Halifax, and the Working Men's Compensation Act, compelling employers to pay damages for injuries to employees.
