(By The Canada Press) TORONTO, Ont., March 20—One of the brightest afternoons since the Ontario Legislature opened was furnished recently by J. Fredrick Reid, Conservative member for West Windsor, who treated Government and Opposition alike in a steady flow of that special brand of wit and likability for which he long has been noted.

Mr. Reid complimented Messrs. Schofield and Poisson on their recent elevation to the Cabinet, and then remarked that Ministers without portfolios were like tables without plates. FORTUNE PRIZE IN BATTLE TO PROVE MAN DEAD

MEMPHIS, March 19. (U. P.)—One of the queerest cases in Tennessee court is expected to be heard here this spring when a court fight will be resumed to prove that Joseph W. Martin, missing heir of a \$1,000,000 estate is dead and that partition of the estate should begin.

The court hearing will be in the form of a petition to remove from the records depositions taken from Clarence Eldridge, Los Angeles, promoter and former resident of Memphis, that the missing man is a resident of Quantana Roo, Mexico. The depositions disclosed that Martin, who dropped from sight 18 years ago in London, England, was living on a ranch in the fastness of the jungles; that he had the belief that relatives and officers were hunting for him and was fearful of his identity being known and further that Eldridge and he had discussed Memphis events.

Two young Memphis attorneys early this year deserted their book-lined offices, donned cork hats and boots and journeyed hundreds of miles from the Mexican coast in search of Martin. After 30-days trip they returned empty handed and without clues regarding the missing cotton man whose evening cape and cane were found on the banks of the Thames river.
