EMBARGO AGAIN PUT ON IMPORT OF ENGLISH CATTLE

OTTAWA, Oct. 27.—Cable advices having been received by the department of agriculture telling of fresh outbreaks of foot and mouth disease in England, a new order has been issued cancelling all permits for the importation of cattle, sheep and other ruminants and swine into Canada from the United Kingdom, except Scotland with the exception of those covering animals already on ship-board en route to Canada.

Animals from Scotland must be embarked at the port of Glasgow and be accompanied by an affidavit from the shipper that the animals shipped have been in Scotland for two months previous to the date of embarkation and also by the usual health authorities.
