Trampast Dead
The noted standardbred sire, Trampast (2), 212 1-4, was found dead in his stall at Maple Lawn Farm, Illinois. He was 23 years of age and his death was unexpected. The horse in 1907 set what was then the world record for two-year-old trotters in a race which he captured the first heat of the junior division of the Kentucky Futurity in 2:12 1-4. He then repeated in 2:16 3-4.

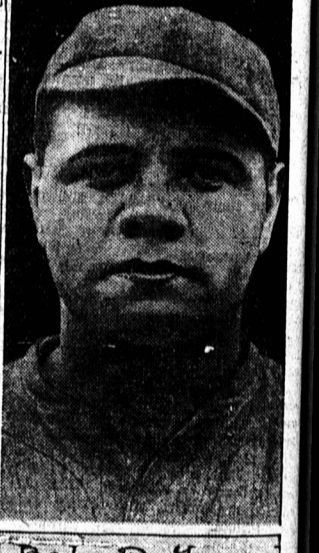
