ANOTHER SIGNPOST

Sir.—The return of the Liberal Government to power by a sensational majority in Thursday's general election in Nova Scotia is an event of much significance. It shows an appreciation of good government. It stamps the mark of approval on the Dominion-Provincial agreement negotiated by Premier Macdonald. It reaffirms once more the abiding faith of the voters in Liberalism and is another signpost that will lead to victory on the 27th. Newfoundland has spoken. New Brunswick is almost unanimous so it is now up to this Province to elect four Liberals in order that Maritime Canada may speak with a united voice and become a strong unit in the Liberal government that will govern Canada for the next five years. A notable victory on Thursday was the return of two Liberals for King's County, N. S. This was the seat that elected Mr. George Nowlan a Progressive Conservative to the House of Commons last fall and the seat Mr. Drew "on the march" but the march has received a severe jolt and the road ahead is gloomy. Another seat held by a Conservative, Percy Black in the Federal field is Cumberland which on Thursday gave a Liberal vote of 7,975. Mr. Black must feel that his tenure of office is near a close.
