UNITED STATES FACING A POTATO FAMINE

BOSTON, Jan. 18-Everyone might as well eat his fill of potatoes now while there are a few left in the market, for there is a possibility that before long the potato will take its place on the daily bill-of-fare along with hothouse strawberries, Louisiana cherries, midwinter peaches and January eggs. To put it another way, there is danger of a potato famine. The dealers have felt a slackening in the supply and have attributed it to the cold weather, which has, of course, made it almost impossible to ship potatoes. The consumers have also felt it to a certain extent as a result of the price soaring to 45 cents a peck-and attributed it to the potato trust. The consumers were wholly mistaken; the dealers partly so. The fact is there is a scarcity of potatoes, due to the failure of the potato crop in several agricultural States. Frank Smith of Wyoming avenue, Malden, a potato merchant, who receives hundreds of carloads from Maine and other points in New England in the course of a year, says the only State that has raised its quota of potatoes this year is Maine. 'The shipping season in Maine is not half over yet, and more than three-quarters of the crop has been shipped out to supply States that in other years have drawn their supply from their own crops,' he declared. 'I suppose some of the farmers are holding back in hope of still higher prices. The potatoes now being shipped are the winter variety. If it wasn't for this crop potatoes would be selling at an enormous price. As it is the farmers are asking \$1 a bushel for their potatoes now and the brokers their potatoes are bound to feel the effect of all this.'

CIVIC POLITICS HOT IN GUELPH

GUELPH, Jan. 18-A wordy war between Chairman S. Carter, of the Light and Heat Committee, and W. J. Bell, in the lobby of the City Hall, yesterday resulted in a fistic encounter. The civic official invited the citizen inside to discuss his department, but the latter refused whereupon Mr. Carter is said to have called Mr. Bell a liar. This was altogether more than he could stand, and he planted his fist on the commissioner's nose. Mr. Carter retaliated with a blow over the eye, but before any further damage could be done, a stalwart alderman stepped between the combatants and the battle was over.
