The following letter has been received by a friend from Private Marcellas McDonald who returned to S. A. some months ago: We arrived here on May 1st from Cape Town. Heidelberg is about 55 miles north of the Vaal River and about 50 miles from Johannesburg. We had a very good trip up making the journey in eight days. All the Canadians are broken up. Some have gone to Bloemfontein, three of the squad to Krugersdorp. Capt. Moore is in charge of M. Squad. We had a very good passage from Canada. Fred. Wayne is acting quarter master sergeant. Captain Moore is well liked by all the squadron. We have not received our horses yet and it is not expected that the squadron will receive any for some time. We are having quite a lot of good drill. I do not see much change in the country since we were here before only it is harder on troops. We cannot move out of our quarters, some fighting going on every day, bridges getting blown up just the same as ever. McRae has gone to hospital but I don't know what is the matter with him. We are at present in tents but in a few days will move into the town and go into barracks. All the Island boys are well. Herdus McLean is Sergeant of No. 3 M. Squad. There are also about five thousand old country men here. We have not received any uniform yet but expect to get them in a day or two. I hope that you are well and enjoying your beautiful Canadian spring. We have the burning sun and cold nights of Africa. The letter is dated May 5th.

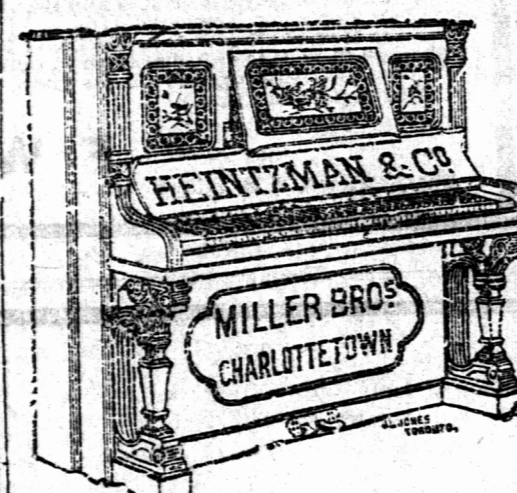
