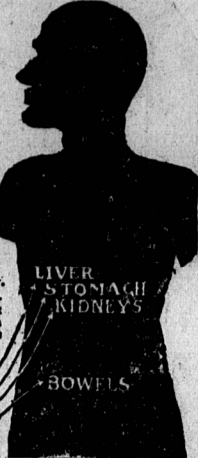

Fordney Tariff Bill Passed

WASHINGTON, July 21.—A Republican protective tariff bill, estimated by Chairman Fordney to raise around five hundred million dollars in revenue annually, was passed tonight by the House by a vote of 289 to 127—precisely the vote by which a Democratic motion for elimination of its United States valuation provision was defeated.

Seven Republicans voted against the measure, while the same number of Democrats supported it. Oil, hides, leathers and asphalt stood up against a determined fight to tax them and remained on the free list. The Longworth dye embargo, first of the five contested schedules to go before the House proper for a separate vote, and backed by most of the Republicans of the Ways and Means Committee, was thrown out, 200 to 193.

There was not much chance of imposing a duty on hides and cotton after the House, in committee of the whole, had defeated amendments carrying compensatory rates on their manufactured products.

When the oil amendment was reached there was such a shout of noes that a roll call was not demanded. A moment later, Chairman Fordney, trying to make himself heard above the din which prevailed during three hours of voting, announced that sentiment in the committee of the whole against taxing asphalt had been so overwhelming that it was not worth while to go through the form of calling the roll.

MRS. D. A. WILSON

A groom was cast over Corvaille and vicinity on Wednesday July 8th, when it became known that Death, "The Grim Reaper," had claimed for his own, one of the most highly respected residents of that place in the person of Mrs. D. A. Wilson.

The deceased had been in failing health for about a year but no serious results were anticipated until about a week prior to her demise when complications developed which suddenly rent in twain the slender thread of life already weakened by her protracted illness.

In the passing away of Mrs. Wilson a void has been created in the hitherto unbroken family circle which the healing lapse of time can never completely efface. Ever solicitous for the welfare of those around her she endeavored herself to all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance by her spirit of true charity, with which was combined those principles of integrity and fair-dealing which made of her an ideal neighbor and the highest type of christian woman.

Italy's War General Robbed by Thieves

MILAN, Italy, July 21.—The villa in Florence belonging to General Count Luigi Cadorna, commander-in-chief of the Italian armies up to and including the Battle of Caporetto, was broken into last night and several important documents bearing to the war was stolen. The theft appears to have had a political character, because silver, ornaments, cutlery, rich rugs, furs and other valuables in the house were left untouched.

It is believed that the stolen documents were some General Cadorna planned to reveal in the war histories he is writing. Certain unidentified political enemies of the former military hero of Italy knowing that such revelations would throw a very bad light on them, are thought to have decided to steal them. Among these enemies are believed to have been the men who let Cadorna bear the responsibilities for the Caporetto disaster, for which they really were to blame.

The thieves were not content, however, with taking the documents that would have incriminated them. They also stole all of General Cadorna's military decorations, as well as those which had belonged to Cadorna's father, General Raphael Cadorna, an Italian hero in the Crimean and Papal States wars. Among the medals stolen was the Collare Annunziata, a decoration Cadorna's father had won in the Italian dependency wars. It is much prized because it entitles the wearer to call himself a cousin of the King.
