**Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations**

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section block of land homesteaded. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after acquiring homestead; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

**GUNNER RAY McDONALD DESCRIBES TRIP TO IRELAND**

Nov. 12, 1916

The weather here is not like what we would have at home; the past two days have been exceptionally fine for the time of year. They claim this is one of their winter months, but to us it appears very mild. Perhaps it won't be so mild after a few weeks but I guess Canadians can stand as much cold weather as any body else.

I wrote you a little account of our trip over; we were then about to leave on our furlough. Quite a number of the boys took the trip to London; they were in charge of some Captain who made all arrangements in advance, and they spent a good day's sight seeing with him. Then they broke up and went on their own hook. They claim to have had a grand time, and speak in highest terms of the treatment received at the different places; in fact all the English people seem to be very kind.

For myself, I took the trip to Dublin and some points in Ireland, excepting Kilmaree, which place I would very much like to see, but owing to the distance to be travelled, we found it impossible to get there and back before our leave expired, so we decided to postpone it to a future time. There was with me: Corp. Hogan, Bdr. Murnaghan, Gunners Wynne, Coyle, Johnson, James McKenna, P. McKenna, John McKenna and C. Craigwell. We left our station after walking about 2 1/2 miles at 6.10 a. m. reaching London at 7.30 a. m. After a good deal of hustling around we took a speed car for 5 minutes ride, then it was up and down elevator for another fifteen minutes and finally reached a railway track underground. We took this and went through the heart of London to Euston Station, more elevators and dodging around till we got to the place where we bought tickets for Dublin.
