THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Dates—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Dates—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

## OLD 105TH BOYS TRANSFERRED TO DRAFTS

When the fifth Canadian division which had been at Witley, England, for over a year was broken up, each of the battalions composing it sent a number of its men to France and the remainder to the Reserve Battalion representing its own Province or district.

The 104th Battalion, composed originally of five hundred men of the 105th P. E. I. Battalion and five hundred men of the old 104th New Brunswick Battalion, with Lieut. Col. Innes of Charlottetown, in command, sent out three drafts each of one hundred men—one draft going to the Fighting Twenty Sixth, N. B. and P. E. Island Battalion, one draft to the 123rd Canadian Battalion, and one draft to the 124th Canadian Battalion.

In each of the three drafts, half the men were from P. E. Island and half from New Brunswick. Several officers accompanied each draft.

The remaining men of the Battalion were transferred to the 13th N. B. and P. E. Island Reserve Battalion at Seaford, Sussex, where is situated one of the big Canadian camps in England, close to New Haven and between Brighton and Eastbourne, two of the great English Coast watering places.

Subsequently another seventy-eight men mostly N. C. O.'s went from the 13th Reserve to the Canadian Machine Gun Depot, and it is expected that they will be in France very soon.

The others will probably go to France in drafts as needed by the 26th Battalion.

## INTERNAL AFFAIRS IN AUSTRIA ARE CRITICAL

WASHINGTON, April 9.—According to an official despatch from Switzerland today, excitement in Slav circles in Austro-Hungary has been increased by the warlike attitude of the organs of the German parties, which defend Czernin and are making violent attacks against the Slavs as well as the Socialists.

Great meetings, the despatch says, were held at Prague Tuesday and Friday. Czech leaders replied to the Austrian Minister of Foreign Affairs declaring that the Czech nation realized that liberty and independence would never come to them from Austro-Hungary or her Allies, and that in spirit of threats, the Czechs would in no way modify their national programme, which is the application of the principles announced by President Wilson in all his speeches.

The situation in Austria, in the same despatch, is stated to be such that the authorities in Vienna have scattered in the factories and on the public highways
