THE KIRK OF ST. JAMES

Preaching last night from the Kirk pulpit on the text "Doth Job believe in God for naught" (Job 1:9), the Minister, the Rev. T. H. Bussell Somers, said: "The upshot of it is simply this: we've got to be brave and make the most of our thought, of the consequences! For a long time, back in the Old Testament, men thought the fields were fairly watching and waiting for the righteous with another sheaf of wheat, and his cattle with a new calf! But they soon found out it wasn't that neat! This way we Christians are being through the life, we're even being sure of health and happiness! I pity the people who are obsessed on that score. They run off into the eye-lane looking for ever headaches and pains. They pick up any doctrine that lies by the side of the road. They listen with ears a-ting and me, this adjust to their difficulties for them and make the way smooth. And religion was never intended for that. It wasn't intended to get us out of trouble and make the pains of living milder. It wasn't intended to be a sort of general household, making up quarrels, clearing up the feathers after we've made them fly, putting things in shape upstairs and down. True, I've known it to take such matters in its stride. It can turn many a wretched, wrangling home into a quiet haven. It has cured more than one bad case of nerves. But you can't aim at any of these. You can't hitch the worship of God to the kind of turn that kind of furrow! Religion was intended to make something out of you! Let the rest take care of itself."
