#### Care Essential For Cheese Ripening

"There is a saying that a cheese is only half-made when it leaves the press. One of the greatest aids to cheesemakers in their production of high quality cheese, and in obtaining at time of grading a more accurate indication of the final quality of their cheese, is correct ripening-room temperature and humidity" said W. C. Cameron, Chief, Dairy Products, Grading and Inspection Services, Dominion Department of Agriculture, at the 18th annual convention of the Eastern Ontario Cheesemakers' Association, held recently at Brockville.

Too much emphasis cannot be placed on the care of cheese in the ripening-room, Mr. Cameron pointed out. However, all the

ripening-rooms were not being held at the approved temperatures of 58 degrees to 62 degrees F. with a relative humidity of 75 per cent. Too often during the past season, officers of the Dairy Products Division found the temperature of cheese on the ripening-room shelves to be nearer 50 degrees than 60.

Ripening-rooms equipped with mechanical refrigeration serve two main purposes — to provide the proper temperature for ripening the cheese, and the proper relative humidity conditions for the control of mould and shrinkage. The relative humidity of the ripening-room also has an important bearing on the ripening of the cheese. Apparently, said Mr. Cameron, some cheesemakers feel that if the room is kept cold say 50 degrees F., the cheese will score higher and mould will not

grow. Both of these opinions are wrong. It is not possible to control mould merely by reducing the temperature. In cheese-ripening rooms, about one ounce of water per day will evaporate from the surface of each cheese. Thus in a room in which there are 320 cheeses, there would be 320 ounces, or two gallons, of water given off each day. Unless this water is removed, the air becomes damp, mould develops, and the cheeses do not ripen properly. To remove the water, it is necessary for the machine to run, because the moisture condenses on the coils when cold, and is removed from the room through a drain pipe. On hot summer days enough heat usually leaks into the room to keep the machine running long enough to condense excess humidity.

#### Bandits Hold Up Store In Windsor

WINDSOR, Ont., Dec. 21 — Two young masked bandits, one armed with a revolver, escaped with \$638 in small bills after a four-minute holdup of a self-service market here last night. There were three customers and four employees in the store when the bandits entered and told manager Sam Cohen to "hand over the money." One customer in the store's rear was not even aware of the robbery until after the pair had made their getaway. This was the store's third robbery.
