STARTLING DISCLOSURES ABOUT TORONTO ABATTOIRS

Made by Experienced Agent in Meat Trade—Says he has Personally Seen Bodies of Cattle and Hogs which Died, Dressed and Disposed of as Food—Inspector Admits that Present Inspection is Inadequate and Has Frequently So Reported.

TORONTO, June 8.—(Special) F. C. Letts, business agent of the meat Cutlers and Butchers Union, who has had experience for many years in the cities of the United States and Canada, and is thereby in touch with the details of the packing industry, makes the startling assertion that he has personally seen dead cattle and hogs which had died while in transit, on arrival in Toronto dressed and disposed of with the rest.

CHARGES MADE AGAINST JEROME

By Prominent Citizens of New York Involve Felony and Misdemeanors.

NEW YORK, June 8.—(Special)—Charges involving felony and misdemeanors against District Attorney Jerome have been filed upon Governor Higgins by five prominent citizens, the chief of whom is Wm. N. Amory, who declares Jerome's continuance in office is a public scandal, a menace to good government and requesting the Governor to dismiss him.
